Transition planning officially begins for students with disabilities at the age of 14 and is a process designed to ensure that students have the opportunity to lead a rewarding and productive life following high school graduation.

The goal of transition services is to support students with disabilities in developing a secondary and post-secondary plan in the areas of Education and Training, Competitive and Integrated Employment, and Independent Living.

Included in this booklet are a list of agencies and services that help provide various supports to students and families during the transition planning process. Many of these supports apply whether your student is transitioning from elementary to middle, middle to high school, or beyond. The names of providers and descriptions contained in this guide may be helpful to you and your child's Transition Coordinator and IEP Team.

Are you and your student ready for high school?

High school can feel overwhelming...new teachers, new school, new classmates, and more responsibility. Prepare for high school by knowing what to expect and practicing good study habits for success.



ADVICE FOR PARENTS —FROM STUDENTS

Frequently Asked Q&A

Q: What happens if a student fails a high school class?

A: The student may be required to complete credit recovery if it is a required course for graduation. School counselors will have these conversations individually and as needed.

Q: Do 9th grade classes and grades count towards graduation?

A: YES! Everything counts: credits, grade point average and which courses (level of difficulty) all become part of your permanent high school record.

HS 101: What to Expect

In high school, each course you take earns credits towards graduation. You will have opportunities to participate in athletics, clubs, and other social activities. Time management and organization become necessary skills to balance your time between activities and homework.

Later in high school, consider studying at a career center, taking college coursework, or begin thinking about a job and earning a paycheck. All of these things will build upon each other to help you achieve your post-graduation goals!

Tips for Success

High school students are learning to be more independent, but still need adult support to provide guidance and set limits on certain activities.

Parents/Guardians:

- **Communicate** with your student and the school about academic goals, courses, school activities, and other questions or concerns.
- Access district and school portals to check grades and attendance.
- Show your **support** by attending performances and games for any sports/activities that your student chooses to be involved.
- **Encourage** your student to be at school every day and to be on time for their classes/activities.
- **Be available** for your student to assist and listen to any concerns they may have. Don't hesitate to include the teachers/school if you need additional support.

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Backwards Planning

What is the plan after graduation?

Although graduation may seem distant, there is always time to begin thinking about the future and different career pathways. Start exploring options and ideas now. We can assist and support you in reaching those goals!

Overview

Start Where You Want to “End”

The transition from school to adult life is an important time for all youth. Backwards Planning is a process used to support a student’s development through this transition. Begin the conversation with the vision or goals for the student’s future adult life, including the skills, knowledge, and resources that may be needed.

Backwards Planning is an informal process. It is meant to be flexible. Goals and plans can and will change throughout the student’s journey into adulthood.

Need to Know

- Keep the end goal in mind.
 - What do you want to accomplish?
 - Why is it important?
 - Is it realistic?
- Start early.
- Identify the student's skills, knowledge, and interests related to the desired goals.
- Multiple people and plans may be involved.
 - Involve Community Supports when available.
 - Check to see if other Resources are available.

Backwards Planning can provide confidence as you move forward toward achieving your goal!



START WITH THE END GOAL

- Identify the outcome
- Write a list of steps and resources
- Set a timeframe for each step
- Combine steps into manageable groups
- Create an outline to begin working on the plan!

Frequently Asked Q&A

Q: Can my student’s plan change?

A: Yes, life happens and we can discuss changes as they occur and are needed.

Q: My student is 16, is it too late to start?

A: No, we can work with your family to assist with future planning. The earlier we start the conversations, the better!


