Take advantage of opportunities to earn valuable college credit before graduating from high school. College Credit Plus (CCP) is available to students in grades 7-12.



Why wait for your future? With Ohio's College Credit Plus (CCP) Program, students can explore rigorous academic opportunities through a wide variety of course options. The purpose of this program is to offer dual enrollment in high school and college courses for Columbus City Schools students as an accelerated pathway toward college and career readiness. To participate, students must:

- Attend an in-person session, watch the informational video, or attend a live virtual session with a parent/guardian. Families who do not complete this step must arrange a separate CCP counseling session with their school prior to participation in CCP
- Submit the State of Ohio Letter of Intent to participate by April 1, 2026 and the CCS District Information Form in order to take CCP classes in their high school, on a college campus, or online.
- Apply to the college/university in which you wish to take CCP courses, adhering to their admission standards and deadlines.
