WHAT MAKES KENWOOD OUTSTANDING?

COMMUNITY Since 1987, Ecole Kenwood has served the Columbus area as the first and only public French immersion school. Staff come from the United States and various French-speaking countries. Our students stem from all over the world with about 23 countries represented. Kenwood students, staff and families make our school a wonderful place to grow and learn.

LANGUAGE

Ecole Kenwood is recognized as a LabelFrancÉducation school. We maintain the rigor necessary for the French Ministry of Education to continue to grant us the Label's "seal of quality for bilingual education in French and another language" (English). Students who are English language learners are provided additional language supports.

CURRICULUM

Instruction centers on Columbus City Schools' and Ohio State Standards. In Kindergarten, students are fully immersed in French for the academic day. By fifth grade, 50 percent of academic instruction is in English, and 50 percent is in French.

UNIFIED ARTS

Kenwood students benefit from physical education, vocal music, visual arts, and more. As students age, their opportunities increase to playing recorders, participating in specialized offerings such as instrumental music classes, choir, and even to performing in a 4th and 5th grade musical.

EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIPS & SUPPLEMENTAL PROGRAMMING

Students in Kindergarten through Grade 5 benefits from a plethora of learning opportunities beyond the classroom setting. Experiences range from visits to Spruce Run Nature Center, the Franklin Park Conservatory, COSI, the Columbus Museum of Art, Momentum Excellence, Spruce Run Historical Farm, Columbus Zoo, Ohio History Museum, Highbanks Metro Park, Columbus Symphony, Lifetown, Kelton House, theatrical and musical performances (the Nutcracker, OSU Marching Band, Columbus Children's Theater, Riffe Center, etc.) to Camp Willson (an educational three-day, two-overnight trip for grades 4 & 5).

AFTER SCHOOL LEARNING & SPORTS

Programs (Girls on the Run, Lacrosse, Let Me Run, and Tutoring) are run by staff and volunteers and vary from year to year.

LANGUAGE IMMERSION FEEDER PATTERN

Rising middle schoolers can continue language immersion at World Language Middle School.

PARENT TEACHER ORGANIZATION

Our parent teacher organization plays a pivotal role in our community. The Kenwood PTO partners with school to support learning opportunities and community engagement events which include but are not limited to Ice Cream Social, Family Movie Night, Fall Festival, Fancy Fair, Winter Extravaganza and Art Fair.
