A Note from the Principal

Parents,

Thank you for all of your support this school year. We are off to an amazing start. If you have not already done so, please download the CCS district app. This will give you information as soon as the district decides on things like early release days, snow days and late busses. The app is the first place that the district posts announcements when it applies to school. Also, please download the bus bulletin as well. If your child rides a bus, this is how you will find out if the bus is running late.

Our Berwick goals are Literacy, Numeracy and Attendance. Our building attendance goal is 96% or higher each day. Every minute counts, so please make sure your child arrives on time and doesn't get picked up early.

Parents we will continue to use Achieve 3000 as a middle school reading program that will support the reading curriculum that the students are being taught in class. In elementary, students in grades K-5 will have the opportunity to use a program called I-Ready. This program will work with students in reading . Both programs are computer based. We are excited to use these programs and continue to increase our academic success.

We will continue to use the MAP assessment for beginning , middle and end of the year benchmarking of student progress. Students in grades 2-8 will also continue to use ALEKS to strengthen math concepts and skills.

Please come out to "Muffins with Mitchell "on September 10th in the library at 9:30am. I look forward to seeing you there. Please don't forget that Open House is September 25th .



While not until spring time, during the next few weeks, parents will see some important items related to our school camping trips. First of all, on September 10, your child will be bringing home all of the items necessary to take part in the cookie dough fundraiser. This fundraiser is crucial to our camping program as it allows us to lower the cost of camping fees for all students. It is also important that all grade levels take part as any fundraising funds not used one year can be applied to the following, meaning it benefits all who take part. So please look out for the cookie dough materials and sell, sell.

Also, the next few months are critical in setting up a team of chaperones for each camping trip. Chaperones are imperative to our camping trip in terms of supervising student groups during the day and in the evening for the overnight camps. September Health News

Here are a few important Back-to-School reminders:

* All students are required to have an updated immunization record on file in order to be in school. Updates include MMR, DTaP, IPV, and the chicken pox vaccine. In addition to these boosters, school age children should have had the Hepatitis B series completed.

* Health screenings will begin in October for grades K, 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th. We will be testing vision and hearing, as well as, the height and weight of your student. If you have any specific concerns, please let the school nurse know!

* Allergy & Asthma season is predicted to hit us HARD this year. Monitor all symptoms closely and follow your health care provider's advice. Medical care plans, rescue inhalers, and Epi pens are a necessity, and may save a life!

* If your student has a health condition or needs special care during the school day such as medication, treatments, or monitoring, please inform the school nurse. Individual health care plans help keep your students safe and healthy.

* PLEASE have a current and working phone number in the school office in the event your child needs your attention.
