#### **Care Connection Program**

The Care Connection Program through Nationwide Children's Hospital is now providing School Based Behavioral Health Service at Hamilton STEM. This service provides treatment and prevention services to students in participating Columbus City Schools. Services include individual, family and/or group therapy to address emotional and behavioral barriers to academic success.

Reasons for therapy may include:

Disruptive behaviors

Anger outbursts

Depressed mood

**Excessive worry** 

Peer Conflict

Reaction to traumatic events

Family conflict

These services are offered 1-2 times per week at school and can occur in the home and community as needed. Families can expect a collaboration with school staff, referrals if needed, caregiver participation and sessions will carry over through school breaks and summer.
