## **ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

June 19 - July 25 (Monday-Thursday)

Note: The first week of summer school begins on WEDNESDAY, June 19, 2019.

**Program Description** ➤ Elementary School summer learning opportunities provide extra support for learners in grades K-4 in core academic areas.

- The Boys and Girls Club provide afternoon activities at many of the district sites.
- An extended day reading camp is designed for third grade students who have not met the requirements of the Third Grade Reading Guarantee.
- Third grade students have the opportunity to take the Ohio State Reading Test on July 9, 2019.

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL

June 19 - July 25 (Monday-Thursday)

Note: The first week of summer school begins on WEDNESDAY, June 19, 2019.

**Program Description** ➤ 5<sup>th</sup> Grade students will now be included in the middle school summer program to support them as they transition to next year. The English Language Arts class provides support to students as they look forward to middle school and the social/emotional differences from an elementary setting through connections to literature. In Math, students will engage in math and coding activities that build problem solving strategies as well as participate in a field trip to the Apple Store. Students will apply science through STEM based activities as they engage in lessons using science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.

**Program Description** ➤ The middle school program (6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>) is structured specifically for students facing grade-level retention and those in need of academic support and intervention. The summer learning curriculum focuses on ELA, Math, and STEM-based Career Exploration through a blended learning environment. Enrollment is based on current grade level.

HIGH SCHOOL June 17 - July 26 (Monday-Friday)

**Program Description** ➤ Advancement Program, or Credit Recovery classes for six weeks. Traditional classes are taught in a classroom setting. VCAP classes are self-paced and combine technology with individualized teacher instruction. Enhanced summer offerings through the Credit Flex process allows students to create individual learning plans. Upon successful completion high school credits are awarded.

End of Course (EOC)-Preparation program at the Arts Impact Middle School, 680 Jack Gibbs Blvd. 43215. All classes are held Monday - Friday, and are offered from 8:00 a.m. - 10:00 a.m., and 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Session 1 - July 1-5, and Session 2 - July 8 - 12 are offered for students who still need to pass one or more parts of the state graduation test or End or Course exams.

Students have the opportunity to take the End of Course exams July 15 - July 29. Registration is required to test.
