

Questions To Ask When Evaluating Summer Camps

If summer camp is a possibility for your child this year, you'll want to keep in mind that some camps have more experience than others when it comes to kids with learning and thinking differences. It's important to find out in advance whether a camp will accommodate your child and, if so, how it plans to meet your child's needs. Here are some questions you may want to ask before signing up.

Questions to ask when choosing a summer camp:

Ч	How about a child who has a lot of energy?
	Do you interview campers? Do you take anyone, or are you more selective?
	How many kids attend each year? How many leave before camp ends? What are some of the reasons for early departures?
	Is your camp accredited by the American Camp Association?
	What are your procedures and rules for keeping campers and staff safe from COVID-19 and other illnesses?
	Do you have experience with campers who have my child's type of learning and thinking differences?
	Is the schedule highly structured, or do kids have a lot of free choice? What is the balance between indoor and outdoor activities? What does a rainy day schedule look like?
	Do campers go on field trips? Where do they go? How are they supervised?
	What accommodations can I expect the camp to make for my child's needs?
	If I provide strategies that have helped my child at home or at school, will your staff use them?
	How does your staff deal with behavior issues? How are kids disciplined?
	What does your staff do if they see a child being picked on or excluded?
	What is the staff-to-camper ratio?
	Who can my child talk to if there's a problem with a counselor or with another child?
	Is there a nurse or someone else on staff to administer medication if needed? Is this done in a confidential way?
	What kind of training is required for your staff? Are your counselors Red Cross certified?
	Have there ever been any serious accidents at your camp? If so, how did the staff handle this?
	Did you fire any camp counselors last year? If so, why?
	Are there opportunities for parents to volunteer at camp?
	Can parents observe their child during the camp day?
	Can you put me in touch with parents of kids who like this camp? Can you put me in touch with the parent of a child for whom the camp wasn't a good fit? Can you put me in touch with any parents of campers who have learning and thinking differences?



In the field of pharmacology, scientists study the interactions between drugs and the body and then apply what they have learned to the development of new drugs. Once a therapeutic drug becomes available, pharmacists work with patients and other health care professionals to ensure patients get the best outcomes from their medications.

Students enrolled in the PPP program will learn through a variety of approaches, including hands-on experiments, field trips and projects. While we primarily explore careers in the pharmaceutical sciences (both clinical and research careers), the program is not designed strictly for students with an interest in pharmacy. In fact, any student with an interest in biomedical science, including careers in pharmacy, medicine, dentistry, laboratory research, etc., is encouraged to apply. This program does not explore careers related to forensic science, engineering or the physical sciences.

2023 Summer Experience Frequently Asked Questions

Registration:

- When are the registration dates for this year's Summer Experience?
 Summer Experience registrations opens March 15, and Pre-K through 8 families should register by May 30; registration for high school students is open through June 11.
- When is the 2023 Summer Experience?
 This year's Summer Experience will take place over four weeks, June 20 through July 28, for Pre-K through 8 students, and six weeks for high school students June 20 July 28.
 - Elementary and middle school students will attend sites Monday through Friday (8 a.m to 1 p.m.) each week, and high school Summer Experience will be held Monday through Thursday (hours vary by building).
- How do I register my student for Summer Experience?
 Applications for the 2023 Summer Experience can be found and submitted in the Parent Portal.
 Important Note for Rising Kindergarten Families (Current Pre-K): Rising Kindergarten families will register for the 2023 Summer Experience through the following link: https://forms.gle/2sZi9Rif8TryLLMZ9
- When registering in the Parent Portal, do I register my student based on their current grade or the grade they
 will enter in the 2023-2024 school year?
 The student should be registered based on their grade for the 22-23 school year.

Transportation:

- Will transportation be provided for Summer Experience?
 Yes. CCS will provide free transportation to elementary and middle Summer Experience school sites, partner sites, and mini camp destinations.
 Please Note: Only PreK students receiving special education services will be provided transportation during Summer Experience. High school transportation will only be provided for students attending Spruce Run.
- Can I change my pick-up and drop-off location after Summer Experience starts? No, transportation is determined at registration and cannot be changed.


- Will after school care be offered during Summer Experience?


 Yes. Extended Day will be offered for students in grades kindergarten through fourth for all elementary

 Summer Experience sites; however, space is limited. Extended Day will be offered Mon-Fri from 1 5 p.m.
- Will meals be provided?
 Yes. Free daily meals (breakfast and lunch) will be provided to all students.
- Will students take part in the same activities at every Summer Experience site?
 No. Summer Experience delivers four weeks of hands-on enrichment, and the themes and activities will vary based on school site.
- Can students participate in Summer Experience virtually?

 Virtual APEX courses will ONLY be available to high school students. High schoolers will be able to participate in virtual credit recovery or credit advancement programs.
- Will students need Chromebooks or other devices during Summer Experience?
 Yes. Students participating in in-person Summer Experience will need to bring a fully charged device to their school site. However, students should not bring their devices to Spruce Run. All other school supplies will be provided.
