### Columbus Recreation and Parks Summer Camps Information

Columbus Recreation and Parks Summer Camps are located throughout the City. Depending upon the camp in which you chose, the costs range between \$90 - \$130 per week, per child. Most of the camps are from 7am-6pm with rotation of activities from 9am-4pm and are offered June 8-July 31 with a few specialty/sports camps offered the week before and week after. Ages are generally 6-12 with a few options for preschool and teens.

### Summer Camp Registration is split into two days.

- a. Thursday, February 6 at 7 pm Registration for Outdoor Education Camps (Indian Village, Camp Terra, Indian Village Preschool, Discover Boating and Camp Turnberry) will begin.
- b. Tuesday, February 11 at 7 pm Registration for Center Camps (Barnett, Buckeye, Far East, Lazelle, Whetstone and Woodward), Horseback Riding, Camp Public Health, Police and Fire Exploration, Sports Camps (All Sorts of Sports, Basketball, Cheerleading, Football, Gymnastics, Hockey, Strength & Conditioning, Tennis and Track), Arts Camps (Great Art Getaway, Dance, Lights, Camera...Camp and Teen Clay Academy), Robo-Go! and Therapeutic Camps.

#### Register online beginning at 7 pm or at Community Centers from 7 pm-8:45 pm.

The online version of the summer brochure will be available in Mid-January at <u>www.ColumbusRecParks.com</u> and the hard copy will be in centers in late January. Registration is done online at <u>www.ColumbusRecParks.com</u>; click Registration and Reservations.

### How to register

- 1. Go to www.columbusrecparks.com\
- 2. Click on Registration and Reservations.
- 3. Login in to your account or create new account.
- 4. Click on "Activities" in blue at top
- 5. On left hand side, under "Filter Search By" place cursor over "Type" check Comm Rec Camps (uncheck all others unless you want Discover Boating or Camp Walnut)
- 6. Find desired camp and "Add to Cart"
- 7. You will need to add each week of camp that you want individually
