Parent Right to Know Information as Required by The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)] and the Every Student Succeeds Act [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)]

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child. Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner.

We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching,
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived, and
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration.

Parent Right to Know Information as Required by The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)] and the Every Student Succeeds Act [Section 1112(e)(1)(A)]

The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) which was signed into law in December 2015 and reauthorizes the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1956 (ESEA) includes additionally right to know requests. At any time, parents and family members can request:

- Information on policies regarding student participation in assessments and procedures for opting out, and
- Information on required assessments that include:
 - o subject matter tested,
 - o purpose of the test,
 - o source of the requirement (if applicable),
 - o amount of time it takes students to complete the test, and
 - o time and format of disseminating results.



Non-Negotiables



Cell Phones/Earbuds

- Bag or pouch -- kept put away
- AirPods/Earbuds need to be put away and not in ears
- ALL STAFF needs to enforce it
- Adults need to model appropriate behavior
 - Refusal responses:
 - Do best to get them to comply
 - Request for Admin support or send to office
 - Contact parent





Non-Negotiables



Hall Passes - 2 Hall Passes per day from Student Planner

- Students need to have their planner for the RR pass
- Names need to be put in the planner in marker on the first day of school!
- Teacher has their own planner for student use that has consequences for not being prepared
- No hall pass list or escort list due to students using a pass every period or extended periods of times





Non-Negotiables

Holding ALL STUDENTS accountable for these expectations regardless of 504/IEP/Etc.

Hoodies/Headwear

- Hoodie worn down on back or tucked in
- Ski mask not worn on top of head
- Non-religious headgear not to be worn (bonnet, headwraps, shower cap, etc)
- ONLY ACCEPTABLE HEADGEAR IS FOR RELIGIOUS PURPOSES

- Health and safety is EVERYONE's responsibility






