Documents Needed to File a FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is an application created and collected by the U.S. Department of Education that collects demographic and financial information from students and their parents to gauge a family's financial strength and is later used to determine eligibility for college financial aid. To efficiently and successfully submit a FAFSA, students and their parents need the following documents:

Student:

- FSA ID (create one at www.fsaid.ed.gov)
- 2019 Federal Tax Return (1040, 1040A or 1040EZ)
- 2019 W-2 (for every job worked during 2019)
- Social Security Number
- Alien Registration Number (non U.S. citizens)
- Driver's license number
- · Records of additional money earned
- Current bank statements

Parent(s):

- FSA ID (create one at www.fsaid.ed.gov)
- 2019 Federal Tax Return (1040, 1040A or 1040EZ)
- 2019 W-2 (for every job worked during 2019)
- Social Security Number(s)
- Records of additional money earned
- Untaxed income records (Social Security, TANF, Welfare, Worker's Comp.)
- Current bank statements
- Current investment records

NOTE: You may be able to have your tax information imported automatically from the IRS into your FAFSA, which can make the process faster and easier. When filling out the FAFSA, log in to the IRS website by providing your name and other requested information to find out if you are eligible.
