

PROSPECTIVE CAHS STUDENT QUESTIONS

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TRANSPORTATION

Q: WHO DO I CALL IF THE BUS DOES NOT SHOW?

A: Transportation at 614-365-5074

Q: HOW DO I SIGN UP FOR TRANSPORTATION?

A: You must "opt-in" through Parent Portal.

Q: CAN YOU CHANGE YOUR BUS STOP?

A: No. High School students are routed within a two mile radius.

Q: WHO AT CAHS HANDLES TRANSPORTATION?

A: Visit or call the main office for help with transportation questions or issues.

CLUBS AND STUDENT LIFE

Q: IS THERE A CLOTHING REQUIREMENT?

A: We do not have a uniform at CAHS. We have a dress code that requires appropriate dress of our students.

Q: WHAT ARE CLUBS LIKE AT CAHS?

A: We have student led clubs at CAHS. They are student created and student run, and vary year to year based on the interests of our scholars. Each fall students apply to run clubs by acquiring a staff advisor and submitting an application. We host a club day during lunch periods where students can join. Transportation after school is typically necessary to participate.

Q: IF THERE ISN'T A CLUB THAT I AM INTERESTED, HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED?

A: Any student can apply to start a new club! They need to acquire a staff advisor and a space to meet.

Q: DOES CAHS HAVE DANCES?

A: CAHS has two school dances each year. Semi-formal occurs in January and is open to ALL CAHS students that are on grade level. Prom occurs in May and is open to Seniors (at their guests) on grade level.

ATHLETICS

Q: ARE THERE SPORTS AT CAHS?

A: We do not have sports on campus at CAHS but we have many talented student athletes. Many students pursue athletics through their neighborhood high school. Students often ride a bus or carpool with other students to their neighborhood 'home school' to participate in after school sports.

Q: HOW DO I GET INVOLVED WITH SPORTS DURING MY HIGH SCHOOL CAREER SINCE CAHS DOES NOT HAVE SPORTS?

A: Students can still participate in sports through their home high school. In order to participate, they would need to contact the athletic director or coach at that school for the sport they are interested in.

A: The VIRTUAL High School Choice Fair will occur on January 10, 2023 @ 6:00 – 7:30 p.m.

Q: HOW DOES THE SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS PROCESS WORK?

A: Selective Admissions Applications accepted 1/9/23 through 1/31/23 (Duxberry, AIMS, Fort Hayes, **CAHS**, Eastmoor Academy and Africentric). General High School and Middle School Lottery applications accepted 1/4/23 through 2/28/23.

ACADEMICS

Q: WHAT IS HUMANITIES?

A: Humanities is a combination of English and History that is taken over three mods (22 minute periods), a little over 1 hour total. The course counts for your freshman year English and Social Studies requirements. All students take Humanities 9 during their Freshman year.

Q: WHAT IS IB?

A: International Baccalaureate (IB) is a global program created to develop inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring young people who are motivated to succeed. The IB gives students distinct advantages by building their critical thinking skills, nurturing their curiosity, and their ability to solve complex problems. The IB strives to develop students who will build a better world through intercultural understanding and respect, alongside a healthy appetite for learning and excellence. The IB Diploma Programme, which is what we offer at CAHS, consists of college-level courses that are rich in discussion, reflections, and deep thinking that occur during 11th and 12th grade. Each course is defined as either Higher Level (HL) or Standard Level (SL), depending on the depth and breadth of content. Courses can be either one or two years in length and always consist of two assessment components: an Internal Assessment and an External Assessment.

Q: HOW DO I BECOME ELIGIBLE FOR THE IB DIPLOMA?

A: The IB Diploma Programme is not available to students until their Junior and Senior year. Typically the only subjects that might limit a student's access to the IB Diploma are Math and World Languages. Students need to earn an Algebra II credit and a credit for Level 3 of a World Language before taking an IB course in those areas. This is something that newly enrolled Freshmen can talk to their counselor about if they need to accelerate at all.

Q: CAN STUDENTS TAKE BOTH AP AND IB COURSES?

A: Yes, students can take both AP and IB courses at CAHS. AP courses are available to students grades 9-12, depending on students satisfying required prerequisites. All IB courses can only be taken in grades 11 and 12.
