Title I: A Parent's Right to Know

Avondale Elementary is a Title I school that receives Federal Title I funding to support academic achievement.

As a parent of a student attending a school that is receiving Federal Title I dollars, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teacher(s) and instructional paraprofessional(s) who instruct your child. Federal law requires every Title I school district to comply and to provide you with the requested information in a timely manner. We are happy to provide this information to you. At any time, you may ask.

Title I funding is spent on supplies, materials, staffing, and programs to support student achievement.

Every student. Every day

Originally passed in December 2016, House Bill 410 encourages and supports a preventative approach to excessive absences and truancy.

Missing too much school has long-term negative effects on students, including lower achievement and graduation rates.

That is why is it very important your child(ren) is/are at school **ON TIME** each, and every day. With HB410, truancy and excessive absences were changed from days to hours, making every minute count!

On your child's report card you may see attendance listed as days absent, "but your child has never missed a day!" When students leave early, arrive late, leave and come back during the day – those minutes are counted as absences and add up to days.

Our breakfast doors open at 8:45 am, and that is when your student(s) can enter the building. We recommend arriving between 8:40 and 8:45 am to ensure enough time for breakfast for your student(s).
