

- Nearly 4,000 CCS students responded to the survey.








## **Reopening School**


- Students were asked the following question about returning to school: How would you prefer to attend school in the fall?
  - 1) In-person at school following all health guidelines, including social distancing, hand-washing, and cleaning.
  - 2) Online learning with Columbus City Schools teachers delivering course content virtually.
  - 3) A combination of options 1 and 2 with students alternating between online and in-person.





## Wearing A Mask


- Students were asked to respond to the following statement:
  "I will come to school if I have to wear a mask."
- Approximately 71 percent of all respondents answered "Yes".





### **Device Availability**


- Students were asked if they currently have a personal computer, laptop, tablet or Chromebook to participate in online learning for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Additionally, students were also asked if they had a District-issued Chromebook to participate in online learning for the school year.
- Less than ten percent of respondents indicated they were without a device to participate in online learning next school year.

CCS Chromebook distribution by grade band (Comparative)



### **Transportation**


- Students were asked the following question:


 Students were asked if they would need additional help from their teacher. They could then select multiple options.

CCS Chromebook Distribution By Grade Level (Actual)





# Chromebook Distribution (Grade Band)


CCS Chromebook distribution by grade band (Actual)


### Personal Device Ownership
