- The purpose of the Superintendent's Community Facilities Task Force is to work collectively to bring recommendations regarding school and administrative consolidations and closures, with successful student outcomes being the bedrock of the work.
- It has been identified that Columbus City Schools spends more on operations and facilities maintenance than academics, which is something that needs to be addressed.
- The Superintendent's vision is to realign resources to provide students with better learning environments that will increase student outcomes and success.
- The Task Force is charged with providing recommendations by June 2024, and implementation taking place no sooner than August 2025.
- Task Force members are a diverse group of individuals that include CCS students and parents, community leaders, faith-based leaders, business and governmental partners, all with direct ties to Columbus City Schools.
