Welcome back Briggs Families and Students. I am honored to serve as your principal. The first day of school for students is Wednesday, August 24, 2022. Transportation is only provided if families opt in and are eligible for transportation. The deadline was August 5, 2022. We will host a family and staff meet and greet on Wednesday, August 17, 2022 from 6pm-7:30pm. 9th grade students and families will have an orientation meeting at 6:30pm.

My main objectives this year are to continue to provide a safe learning environment and strengthen the existing academic and SEL structures, including our Bruin STRONG PBIS program and student leadership program. Briggs will be one of the high school's piloting Student Led Restorative Practices this year. My other main objectives are to increase our graduation rate, academic performance on all state assessments, and student participation in our CCP(College Career Credit Plus) and AP courses, and student extracurricular activities.

Student Chromebooks and CCS Recommended Back to School Supplies

Every CCS student has been/will be assigned a district Chromebook. Students who attended a CCS school last year should have kept their assigned Chromebooks and will use them at their assigned school during the 22-23 school year. Students new to the district or who, for some reason, were not assigned a Chromebook last year (as indicated in Infinite Campus) will receive one during the first week of school at Briggs. We will provide Briggs backpacks for our 9th graders and student new to the district/Briggs this year. All other students should return to Briggs using their Briggs backpack to keep their Chromebook safe and undamaged. Other recommended supplies include:

- Notebook paper and/or spiral notebooks

<u>Guide to Student Success Handbook</u>

The 2022-2023 electronic Student Guide to Success is now available. The publication contains important documents that must be filled out and returned to your student's school of attendance OR completed as part of the <u>Parent Portal Annual Update (preferred method) in Infinite Campus</u>. The Annual Update can be accessed in the Parent Portal by first clicking on "More" and then "Annual Update." If your scholar has a form on file and he or she is remaining at the same school for 2022-2023, a new form will not have to be submitted. If your scholar has changed schools or matriculated to a new school, a new form must be submitted. Separate forms must be on file for each individual student.

SCHOOL DRESS CODE

We are charged with preparing students for college and careers. This dress code aligns with this goal in that it prepares students to understand the level of dress expected in these areas. Some highlighted areas of the full CCS dress code (found on the CCS website) are:

Students must be appropriately covered at all times = No bare midriffs or shirts/dresses with straps thinner than 2 fingers in width. No halter/tube tops or dresses. No sleepwear or blankets / No Gang related apparel

No t-shirts with drug or sexualized images or statements are permitted.

Hoodies and hats are not to be worn inside the building.

Shorts and skirts should be long enough so that when the arm is completely extended the hem reaches past the student's fingertips.

No sagging pants, pants with chains or spikes on belts or spikes worn as jewelry, or ripped pants above the fingertips.

Attendance/ House Bill 410

It is important for your child to attend school every day. When your student misses a significant amount of school, even if the absences are excused, the child misses critical instruction time and learning opportunities. This often has long-term, negative effects on a child, such as lower achievement and a greater chance of not graduating on time. A new state law defines excessive absence and truancy: Excessive absence: a student misses 38 or more hours of school in a single month, or 65 or more hours in one school year, with or without a legitimate excuse. Truancy: a student is absent from school without legitimate excuse for 30 or more consecutive hours, 42 or more hours in one school month, or 72 or more hours in a school year.

Arrival/Dismissal Procedure

1. The front of the school is for school buses only after 7am and 2pm. This is for the safety of all students.

2. Students can be dropped off or picked up at the rear of the building – please be cautious and drive slowly around the school as both staff and students are crossing the drive.

3. Breakfast is served from 7:00-7:25 am and school begins promptly at 7:30.

4. If you need to pick your student up early for an appointment, please do your best to do so before 2:15 so that you will be able to exit – after this the buses will block the exit for the safety of students and so that the buses can exit promptly.

5. Students are released at 2:30 pm and are to exit the building unless they are here for an extra-curricular activity and supervised by a Briggs coach or staff member.
