Can I receive tuition reimbursement during my entire RN program?

 YES, tuition reimbursement is based upon the calendar year (Jan-Dec) and each year your eligible amount starts over (\$3000/\$5250)

If I continue with OhioHealth as an RN after graduation will I be eligible for additional tuition benefits to pursue advanced degrees? (RN-BSN, MSN, NP, DNP)

- YES, once you become a full-time associate your tuition benefit amount will automatically increase to \$5250 a year.
- \$5250 is the amount allowable by the Federal Government before you would have to be taxed
