ADDING TRANSITION SIGNALS

-Have students work in pairs to complete this ADDING TRANSITION SIGNALS ACTIVITY (PDF, Google Doc). You may share this digitally via Google or as a handout. To begin, each pair needs to read through sections 1-4 on the ADDING TRANSITION SIGNALS ACTIVITY (PDF, Google Doc) following this protocol. Partner 1 reads section 1 and Partner 2 reads section 2. After each section, the partner who did not read should summarize the information read by his/her partner. For sections 3 and 4, the pair should read those individually and then discuss what they read. Section 5 contains the activity and should be completed individually until the end when they are instructed to share and give feedback.

-Your role will be to circulate and aid where needed, noting students' abilities to use transition signals. Here is a sample answer for Section Five:

The concept of fairness is central to understanding plagiarism. Fairness means being fair both to yourself and others. <u>Moreover</u>, everybody both gives and receives their proper due, and nobody has anything to complain about. <u>For example</u>, an incident involving unfairness could be taking someone else's work and passing it off as your own. <u>As a result</u>, the person whose work has been taken receives no recognition or acknowledgment for their research and thinking. <u>Furthermore</u>, writers who plagiarize are not being fair to themselves either because they are not "developing their own independent academic skills" (Passage 1). <u>Therefore</u>, students who do their own work with due acknowledgement of the work of others should develop their own academic skills and self-confidence far more than those who merely misuse the work of others. <u>Thus</u>, to understand plagiarism, one must first understand how it is unfair to both the person plagiarizing and the person being plagiarized.

-At the end of the time you have allotted for this lesson (it should be a partial period), ask students to keep the ADDING TRANSITION SIGNALS ACTIVITY (PDF, Google Doc) for reference to use in the future when they compose writings.
