# ACCOMMODATIONS FOR MAP® ASSESSMENTS

The adaptive nature of the MAP assessments makes them appropriate for students with a wide range of skills and needs. For those students who need accommodations, use the following guidelines.

### **Accommodations Allowed**

It is Columbus City Schools' opinion, in conjunction with NWEA, that the following accommodations will not impact the validity of the student's test score. **These accommodations can be used with all students.** 

#### **Presentation Accommodations**

Read/Reread, simplify, or clarify *directions*; i.e. clarifying the location of the NEXT button

Use visual magnification devices or software; i.e. MAP is compatible with Zoom Text Magnifier 9.1 or MAGic 11)

Use auditory amplification devices, audio aids, noise buffers, or software

Use masks to block a portion of the screen; i.e. student may use a sticky note, index card, or blank sheet of paper to move down the screen as he/she is reading

Color contrast

Screen reader on MAP Math Assessment ONLY; i.e. software application that identifies and interprets what is being displayed on the screen

Refreshable braille

Text-to-Speech on MAP Math Assessment ONLY

Human reader – in MAP Math Assessment and in one-on-one setting ONLY

Student reads test aloud – in one-on-one setting ONLY

Response Accommodations - Scribes, educational assistants, and other people supporting a student during testing must be neutral in responding to the student during test administration. Assistance in test administration must not lead a student to the correct answer. The student's response must accurately represent the student's own choice.

Assign a scribe to record responses

Dictate responses to a scribe

Point to response for a scribe

#### **Setting Accommodations**

Test an individual student in a separate setting

Test a small group of students in a separate setting

Minimize distractions; i.e. use a study carrel

#### **Timing/Schedule Accommodations**

Administer test over multiple sessions in a day

Administer test over a number of days – within the limits of your district's test administration guidelines

Allow flexible schedule

Extend time for testing – ALL MAP assessments are designed to be untimed for all students

## **Timing/Schedule Accommodations (Continued)**

Administer the time of day that is most beneficial to student

Offer breaks

#### **Materials or Devices Accommodations**

Provide scratch paper

## Accommodations NOT Allowed

It is Columbus City Schools' opinion, in conjunction with NWEA, that the following accommodations **will** impact the validity of the student's test score **and therefore are NOT permissible**. This applies to all students, including those students with an IEP or 504 plan.

### **Accommodations NOT Allowed**

Native Language Translation

Reading aloud questions, translating, reading answer options, and/or any portion of the **MAP READING**Assessment

Defining words within the test question

Dictionary/Thesaurus of any kind (English, Spanish, or Bilingual)

Manipulatives of any kind; i.e. abacus, multiplication table, individualized manipulatives, etc.

Using a calculator for questions that do not have an on-screen calculator

Any other accommodations that are not listed in the Accommodations Allowed Section
