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Intervention Resources

6. Achieve3000 [achieve3000.com](https://www.achieve3000.com) Access through Clever at clever.com/in/columbuscity.

This literacy tool is earmarked for use in the College and Career Ready intervention classes but may be used in Core Enrichment or at other building-designated times. Targeted use by students reading two or more grade levels below their current grade level can increase their Lexiles and reading skills. It can also be used by all teachers to access Lexile-leveled, nonfiction passages for use with any students. NOTE: Student Lexiles are measured by MAP tests during BOY, MOY, and EOY. 8. Mini-Qs for Literature

Each middle school teacher/student has access to [Mini-Q Volume 3](https://tinyurl.com/MinQContents) (<https://tinyurl.com/MinQContents>) online through Clever (clever.com/in/columbuscity) and one hard-copy binder through the ELA Curriculum Liaison for their building. This resource pairs readings on a topic or novel with culminating writings. It mirrors standardized testing and meets many learning standards.

9. Scholastic or Lakeshore Publishing Classroom Libraries

Each middle school/ and 6th grade classes in elementary buildings received classroom libraries, either in 2013 or 2016. The novels can be used for literature circles, student choice readings in workshop, or independent reading.

10. CommonLit ([CommonLit.org](https://www.commonlit.org)) Access through Clever at clever.com/in/columbuscity.

This online literacy tool contains literary and informational passages with standard-aligned questions, a guided reading mode for struggling readers, lesson plans, and paired texts among its features. It can be used in the same manner as a textbook. It can also be used by TBTs for common assessments targeting particular standards, by teachers/buildings for standard mastery diagnoses and monitoring, for simulating AIR assessments, for finding quality pairings for novels or themes, etc. Principals, department chairs, and coaches have access to building-wide data from this tool. Login by selecting the CommonLit Icon through the Clever portal.

11. TeachingBooks ([TeachingBooks.net](https://www.teachingbooks.net)) Access through any Clever or CCS computer.

This online library of novel and author resources is free to all teachers and librarians. Among the resources are lesson plans, author interviews, videos, text complexity charts, etc. Anything on the site can be shared with students and parents in varied ways such as Google Classroom, QR code, email, or bookmark.
