Board Goals



Strengthen Reading Proficiency

The percentage of third-grade students proficient in Reading on the Ohio State Test (OST) will increase from **34.5%** in school year 2022-2023 to **44.5%** in June of 2028.



Strengthen Mathematics Proficiency

The percentage of seventh-grade students proficient in Mathematics on the Ohio State Test (OST) will increase from 14.7% in school year 2022-2023 to 23.45% in June of 2028.



Closing Opportunity Gaps

The percentage of 4-year graduation cohort students who complete state and district graduation requirements will increase from **78.2%** in August of 2023 to **83.2%** in August of 2028.





During this stage, it's important to nurture their curiosity and independence, as well as allow them to explore texts, including short stories, newspapers, comics, and age-appropriate books.









Family Reminders Every word you say builds your child's brain



Research shows that children do better in school when their parents talk and interact with them from birth. Make the most of your time together by using the **3Ts**.

Tune In: Be in the moment.

Talk More: Use a wide variety of words.

Take Turns: Engage your child in conversation.

When you use all **3Ts** at once, you build the strongest possible brain for your child.






Playtime

- · silly song










Mealtime

- · leafy broccoli








Questions?

Pay attention to what your child is focused on, then talk about it to have a conversation!







ABC's for parents of little ones...



AWARENESS

Be aware of your own inner state. Is your heart rate elevated? Are you feeling tense/frustrated, etc.? Children can FEEL our upset, so the next step is BREATHE DEEPLY and bring yourself back to the present moment.



BREATHE

Take deep belly breaths. Inhale through your nose for at least 5 seconds, and exhale through your mouth for at least 10 seconds. Do this at least 3 times.



CLOSENESS

They want to be close to you because you are their Safe Place™. Co-regulation and connection/bonding happen when they are close to you. Take deep breaths with them in moments of closeness.


Come see the Huntington Holiday Train at Main Library

Final Thoughts



Talk with your child

Give them chances to respond. Ask questions and build on what they say. Keep the conversation going.

Read with your child

Read with fun voices, talk about the pictures, and ask questions. Point out letters and new words.

Play with your child

Play together and try different roles. Use new words and act out what they mean.



Final Thoughts

CONVERSATION TIPS

- Ask questions about the characters after reading a book together.
- Play games like "I Spy" that use descriptions.
- When you're in the car or on a walk, talk about what you see and ask your child questions.
- Talk about books when you're out together. This connects books to real life.
- Talk about other places you see words, like road signs, stores, and packages.

OTHER READING ACTIVITIES

- Sing songs and play rhyming games.
- Ask your child to help write a grocery list.
- Read recipes out loud while cooking together.
- Go to storytime at the local library.
- Write and mail a letter to someone special.
- Match words that start with the same letter.
- Sign up for free books through Dolly Parton's Imagination Library of Ohio.


