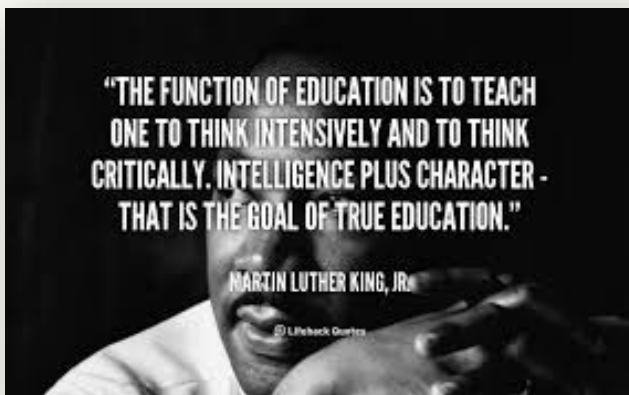

Award(s): Range from \$20,000 to \$75,000 over a one year period.

Eligibility: Public, Private, Other, Charter

Deadline(s): For new applicants, applications are due **February 1** and August 1, annually. For returning applicants, applications are due May 1, annually.

Do's and Don'ts - Finance and Administration

Do spend Title I early and often. LEAs and schools are legally obligated to promptly spend their federal education grants and limit carryover as much as possible. Spending early is advantageous for academic achievement. Title I is intended to help disadvantaged students prepare for challenging state assessments, after all.

Don't make presumptions about supplement, not supplant. Under ESSA, an LEA shows compliance with supplement, not supplant through a methodology demonstrating all Title I schools are receiving state and local funds it would receive if not a Title I school. ESEA Section 1118(b)(2).

Do use Title I funds to provide books to families for summer reading. LEAs and schools can use their Title I, Part A funds to buy books for families for summer reading. LEAs have gotten in trouble when they could not demonstrate that they were promoting family literacy.

Don't combine annual Title I meeting with other school activities. The intent of the annual Title I meeting should be clear: to explain Title I, Part A programs and parents' rights to be involved their children's education according to ESSA Section 1116©.

Do strive for open competition whenever possible—Open competition should always be a district's goal when selecting vendors.

Do tap Title I for computer warranties—funds may be used to purchase a warranty for maintenance, repair, and upkeep as long as your district would purchase the same warranty with nonfederal funds.
