### Fund For Teachers (FFT) Fellowship Grant— Professional Development Projects

#### Deadline: January 21, 2021

**Description:** Fellowships of up to \$5,000 to USA PreK-12th grade educators and up to \$10,000 to educator teams for projects that support professional growth and development. Funding is intended to offer educators the tools required to pursue self-designed professional learning experiences. All applicants must apply online between November 1, 2020 and January 21, 2021 with final submission made by 5 pm CST on January 21, 2021.

### COVID-19 Remote Learning Emergency Fund for Educators

The National Geographic Society recognizes that educators, who are among the many dedicated individuals on the frontlines of the COVID-19 pandemic, are pioneering new ways of teaching so that students can continue learning.

The fund will distribute support ranging from US \$1,000-\$8,000 to individual educators (or to an individual educator working in collaboration with other educators or <u>National Geographic Explorers</u>) to design instructional resources that help educators effectively teach in inperson, remote, or hybrid learning environments during this pandemic. Priority for this opportunity will be given to educators working in communities that have been particularly hard hit by the pandemic, and who have not previously received National Geographic funding.



# Federal Grant Updates and Answers to frequently asked questions (also sent

via email on 12/7/20 from Lisa Stotz)

## SQIG

 Carryover has been approved today and updated budgets are now loaded into MUNIS based on conversations that took place during consultations.

### SIG G

- Carryover is working through the approval process and we anticipate it will be available in approximately a week.
- Please <u>prioritize</u> this grant spending as this is the final year and all remaining funds will be returned to the state and federal government.
- Funds are available to spend through the summer.

# Non-Competitive Supplemental School Improvement (SSI)

- Is not available from the state yet. We anticipate it will arrive in January sometime. We are not able to begin spending until it is loaded into Munis.
- All unexpended funds from last school year will carry over into this year. In addition, the state is saying that some additional funding will be added to the carryover funds received. We do not yet know how much funding that will be.
- Categories for spending include: Leadership Development, Climate and Culture, and Curriculum and Assessment. No direct student instruction permitted.
- The spending limit of 30% for materials and equipment is still in place. Of which no more than half (or 15%) can be spend on equipment. However, the state is starting to loosen up on this

limitation if a justification can be provided for the additional need.

### Title I

- All Title I schools will receive additional Title I carryover funds. These additional funds will be approximately a 10% increase to existing allocation and will be available in January when released by the state.
- Salary and fringe budget reviews are ongoing and the necessary adjustments are being made to ensure budgets are in line with projected costs.
- FY 22 planning will begin in January ahead of the Article 211 process. More information to follow.

### Title I Crate

- Some beginning of year documentation was delayed or not available as a result of our prolonged virtual school year. In particular, the Student Compact has not been made available as of yet since is it normally a part of the Guide to Student Behavior booklet. We have pushed back the due date and are working with District personnel to determine a way to meet this compliance requirement.
- Please continue to upload your Title I compliance documentation. Regardless of how the school year progresses, all compliance requirements are still required even if in a modified format.
- Needs assessment section your school improvement plan can fulfill this requirement as there are needs assessment sections within the plan.

- Host annual Title I meetings.
- Dedicate at least one percent of title I funds for family engagement, with parents involved in deciding the best use of these funds.
- Develop a compact that outlines shared responsibilities for student achievement for parents and school staff.
- Build parent capacity by explaining state academic standards, showing how parents can support student learning at home.
- Provide take-home educational materials.
- Coordinate with other federal, state, and local programs, including early childhood and English learner programs.
- Provide materials in a language parents can understand, to the extent practicable.
