GRANT OPPORTUNITIES

NCTM Enhancing Student Mathematics Learning through the Use of Tools and Technology Grants:

This technology grant from the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics provides PreK–12 teachers with funding to purchase digital math curriculum or resources for their classroom.

Who's Eligible: Teachers who are members of the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics

How to Apply: Submit a proposal and application by the November 15 deadline.

NSF Discovery Research Grant

This edtech grant from the National Science Foundation provides funding for STEM programs in PreK–12 classrooms.

Who's Eligible: PreK–12 educators with financial need

How to Apply: Send a full grant proposal by the second Wednesday in November each year.

Arts Fund

Amount: Varies

Description: The Arts Fund is one of five "Spotlight Funds" from Adopt a Classroom. Unlike Adopt a Classroom's typical crowdfunding model, Spotlight Funds let teachers apply for grants and get funding for specific school needs. Money from the Arts Fund can be used toward art supplies, musical instruments, theater costumes, and more.

Who Qualifies: K-12 teachers

Deadline: Rolling

American Family Insurance Dreams Foundation Grant

Amount: Varies, but the average award is \$10,000

Description: Funds can be used for needs like meal programs

or for learning initiatives like reading programs.

Who Qualifies: Teachers and educators who work for nonprofit schools, libraries, community centers, or other nonprofit organizations

Deadline: Applications are accepted in February of each year.

Naiku Innovative Teacher Grant

Deadline: Ongoing (30 total awards in 2021, with applications accepted until Nov. 1)

Teaching Gardening Grants Program

What It Is: The American Heart Association works with schools to find local sponsors to help fund the installation of raised bed gardens in schools.

Award: Up to \$1,000

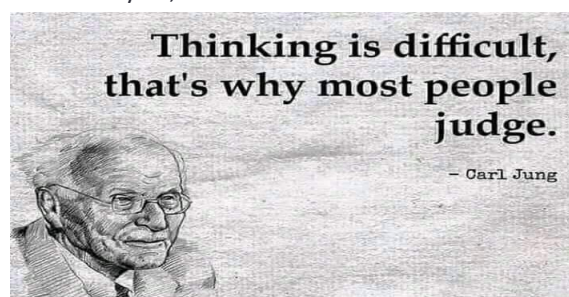
Deadline: December 2021

Mockingbird Foundation

What It Is: The Mockingbird Foundation, Inc. offers competitive grants to schools and nonprofit organizations that effect improvements in music education for children.

Award: \$100-\$10,000

Deadline: January 15, 2022

Dos & Don'ts

Do keep accurate inventory of Title I equipment, supplies

Schools that purchase equipment using Title I must be sure to document procedures for managing equipment records are among the most common errors cited during federal audits. Inaccurate or out-of-date equipment lists, inventory lists with inaccurate custody of location information, and a lack of any regular physical inventory processed lead the list of problems.

At a minimum, an inventory of equipment purchased in whole or in part by federal funds must occur at least once every two years. Inventory should be identified by:

- Property description
- Serial number or other identification number
- Source of funding for the equipment,
- Title holder
- Acquisition date
- Cost of the property
- Location of property
- Condition of proper
- Ultimate disposition data of the property including disposal date

Don't rule out using ESSER funds for IEP costs related to COVID-19

While ESSER funds should not be used to replace IDEA funds allocated to pay for IEPs, they can be used to pay for changes to IEPs related to the COVID-19 pandemic. CARES Act ESSER I and CRRSA Act ESSER II require that funds be used for expenditures "because of COVID-19" but ARP ESSER funds can be used more flexibly. *Tiffany Kessler - Brustein & Manasevit PLLC*

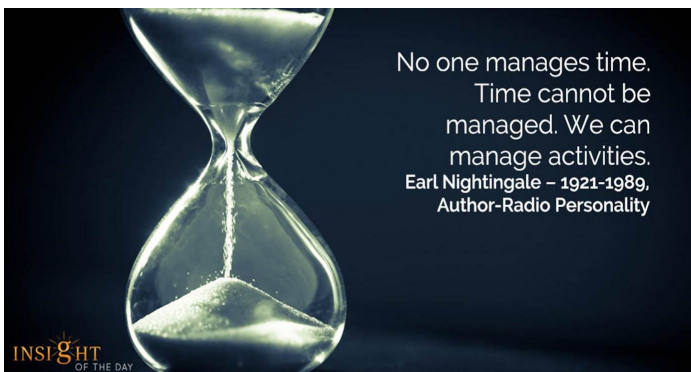
