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# **Questions to Dig Deeper When Reading**

#### **Details**

- Describe the characters (or setting)
- What were the important events?

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#### Language

- What were some interesting words in the story? How were they used in a sentence?
- Were there interesting patterns in the language of the story?
- Were there any words you didn't know? What do you think they mean?



## **Multiple Perspectives**

- Who is telling the story? How would the story be different if told by a different character?
- How does the storyteller's (author or character) experiences influence the way the story is told?
- Describe a specific event from the perspective of a person in a related career.



#### **Patterns**

- What patterns did you notice?
- Were you able to predict what would happen?
- Did any events repeat in this story?



#### **Trends**

- Are there patterns or attributes or sequences of events similar to those you have read in other books by this author or in the genre? (ie. Common among fairy tales or books by Dr. Seuss)
- What do you notice is the same or different about books written during the same time period?



## **Changes Over Time**

- What changes did the character(s) experience?
- What caused changes in the story timeline or setting?
- How would the story be different if it took place earlier in history? Later in history?



## Big Idea

- What is the big idea or theme of the story?
- Is there a lesson in the story/chapter?
- Can you think of another story that has the same big idea?



#### **Ethics**

- What is the problem in the story?
- What are the different choices the characters could make?
- What are the pros and cons of those choices?



## **Connections Across Disciplines**

- How does this story relate to something you have experienced in your life?
- Is this story related to something else you have read? In what way?
- Does this story contradict something else you have learned or read? In what way?



#### **Unanswered Questions**

- What do you wonder after reading the story?
- If you were to meet the author, what questions would you ask him/her about the story?
- If you could talk to a character, who would you talk to and what would you want to know?
- If you could visit the time or place of the story, what would you want to see or experience more?
