

Board approves reassignments

Fifty-one administrative reassignments recommended by Superintendent Joseph L. Davis have been approved by the Columbus Board of Education for the 1982-83 school year.

For the first time in 10 years, no promotions are being made. Davis said the closing of 13 schools this year and a need to reduce the administrative staff are among the reasons there are no promotions.

Promotions during the past 10 years have ranged from a low of 12 in 1976 to a high of 40 in 1972, he said. The average has been 22.4 a year.

The administrative staff paid through the district's general fund should number 292 at the end of 1982, Davis said.

The district had 300 administrators, mostly principals and assistant principals, paid through the general fund at the start of the 1981-82 school year.

In all, the district had 330 administrators, including those paid through outside state and federal funds, at the start of the 1981-82 school year.

Fourteen administrative positions were eliminated as a cost-saving measure by the school board in March.

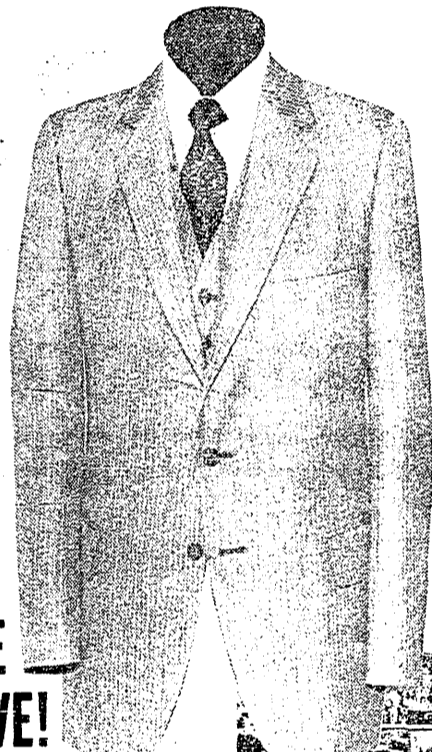

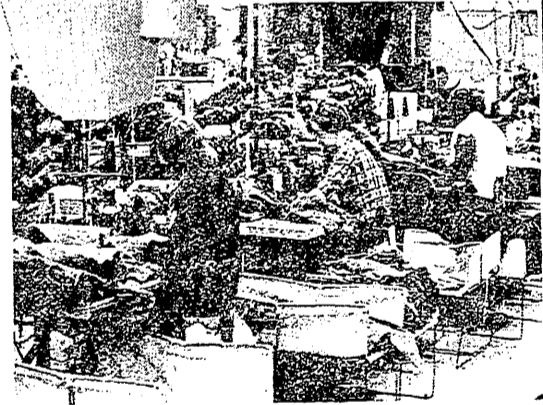

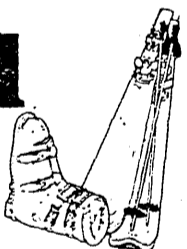
