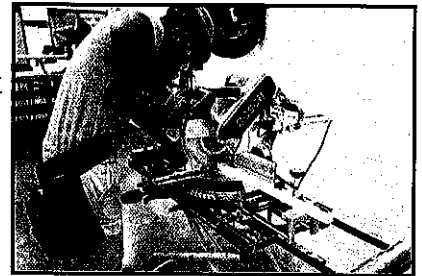

NCCER Certification

- Obtain a NCCER - Construction Certification that can be used in construction remodeling
- Learn to safely operate construction tools and equipment
- Build various structures including floor, wall and roof systems
- Install numerous finishes such as flooring, cabinetry, trim work, siding and roofing
- Understand and work with electricity, plumbing and HVAC components of a remodeling project
- Interpret blueprints and understand schedules and planning through the completion of a remodeling project



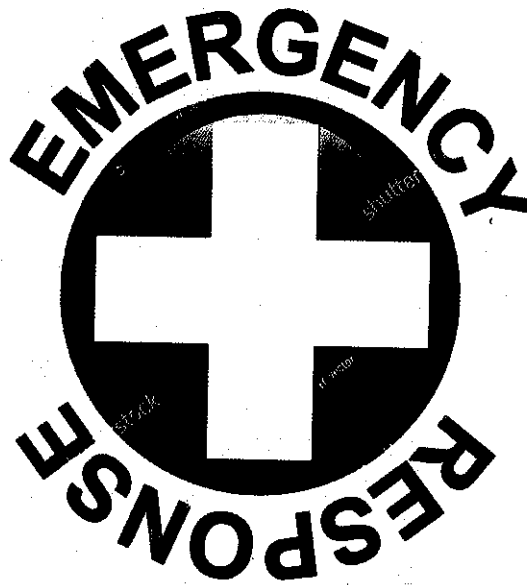
ASE (Automotive Service Excellence)

Emergency Medical Responder

This is the entry level Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) course prepares students to provide basic emergency medical care for ill or injured persons prior to the arrival of emergency medical personnel who provide higher level care and transport of patients to healthcare facilities. Emergency Medical Responders possesses the basic knowledge and skills necessary to provide lifesaving care while awaiting the arrival of an EMS team. EMRs perform interventions with equipment within the confines of the scope of practice in the State they are practicing as well as the medical director of the organization they are affiliated with. The EMR course covers the National Emergency Medical Services Education Standards set forth by the U.S. Department of Transportation, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The Standards have been approved and adopted by the Ohio Department of Public Safety, Board of Emergency Medical Services. A daily schedule and clinical expectations will be provided on the first day of the EMR course.

A student must request an Adjustment Transfer through your building principal to participate.
