




HOW CAN WE CONTACT YOU?



INFINITE CAMPUS


- All grades are posted regularly on Infinite Campus





HOW WE CAN HELP

Elementary School: Every 2nd grader in the CCS district is inspired to think about college with the I KNOW I CAN children's book.

Middle School: All 6th-8th grade CCS students and families are invited to **Blueprint: College**, a series of workshops that provide information on the college planning process. IKIC offers **classroom presentations** about college and career planning in every CCS middle school.

High School: An I KNOW I CAN advisor is in every CCS, South-Western and Whitehall high schools to help students prepare for college. IKIC also offers classroom presentations about college and career planning. Outside of school hours, Blueprint: College High School delivers relevant and in-depth information on the college planning process to students and families. IKIC offers college application and ACT/SAT registration assistance to eligible seniors, up to 3 college application fee waivers or payments, and will also pay for one ACT or SAT test during a students' junior or senior years after the student has used fee waivers. One-on-one assistance and evening workshops at CCS schools assist students and families in completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Computers are available in the office for students to complete steps in the college application or FAFSA process.

Retention: IKIC advisors are available at 15 Ohio college campuses to help students with the transition into college and to stay on track to graduate.

IKIC FUNDING SOURCES FOR CCS STUDENTS

Founders' Scholarship: Up to \$10,000 – A competitive scholarship renewable for four (4) years for Columbus City Schools students

I Know I Can Grant: Up to \$1,200 – Renewable for four (4) years for qualified CCS graduates demonstrating financial need

Save Smart Sr Program: A post-secondary Individual Development Account (IDA) savings incentive program in which eligible CCS 12th grade and college students save \$250 and receive a \$1,000 match in addition to the \$1,200 IKIC grant
