



Read Across America Week



FOR FAMILIES

Dear Families.

Read Across America Week is the first week of March!

Below are some ideas for how you can celebrate literacy during Read Across America Week at home with your children:

Family Book Club:

Throughout the week family members can take turns choosing a book to read. At the end of the week, the family can get together and talk about their favorite book and why.

Reading Scavenger Hunt:

Make a scavenger hunt word list for your child to read and check off this week during daily family activities including grocery store visits, car rides, at the park, and on walks or hikes.

Library Day:

Pick a day out of the week to take the kids to your local library! There, you can take some time to choose books for the family book club, and the kids can pick their favorite books to read before bed. Your child's CCS Student Success Card will allow them to check out books at any Columbus Metropolitan Library branch!

Reading Picnic:

On a warm day this week, take a book and some snacks outside to read and picnic as a family. This will be a great way to enjoy nature, family time, and a good book!

Story Charades:

Choose a story your family knows well (a well-read book or fairytale), and act out the beginning, middle, and end of the story. If you have more family than characters, a few could do the acting and the others can be the audience or be the narrator.

Reach Out and Read:

Get loved ones who live far away involved in some family reading.
Use Zoom, Face Time, Skype, or any other video conferencing platform to call a family member and have your child read a book with that relative.

Nourishing the Mealtime:

Have your kids read grocery lists and recipes aloud to you while you're preparing for dinner. This kind of family reading will help build vocabulary, spark conversation, and become a beloved memory.

Write a Letter to the Author:

After reading a book, sit down with your child and write the author a letter. Have your child ask questions about the book or provide their reactions. You can mail the letter to the author or the publisher.

New Student Enrollment Process for 2024 - 2025 Now Open



Changes have been made to the enrollment process for the 2024 - 2025 school year. Below you will find the new enrollment process:

- Online Registration for grades K- 12 (for a student's assigned school based on address, not lottery application) for the 2024-2025 school year begins January 3, 2024.
- Families must complete the 2024-2025 Online Registration to begin the enrollment process instead of making an appointment to complete enrollment in person at Central Enrollment.
- Enrollment appointments for ES, MS, and HS will NO LONGER BE REQUIRED, but are available as an option for families who would like assistance.
- ONLINE REGISTRATION APPLICATIONS ARE PROCESSED IN THE ORDER THEY ARE
 RECEIVED. NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT IS BASED ON COMPLETION OF THE ONLINE
 REGISTRATION. Registration is not complete until all necessary documentation is uploaded to
 the application. THIS DOES NOT APPLY TO LOTTERY APPLICATIONS.

Please take time to thoroughly review the necessary documents to ensure that the application is not delayed in processing.

 FIRST COME - FIRST SERVED process is for NEW students wishing to attend their HOME SCHOOL based on ADDRESS, not participate in SCHOOL CHOICE LOTTERY. School choice lottery is NOT first come - first served.
