SAFELY WELCOMING MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS BACK TO CLASSROOMS THIS WEEK:

Today Columbus City Schools safely welcomes the first cohorts of middle and high school students back into the classroom, transitioning into a blended learning model that has two days of in-class learning combined with three day of at-home remote learning.

Starting with grades 6, 11, and 12, our middle and high school students are returning to inperson learning in a phased-in plan.:

Week of March 15: All students in grades 6, 11, and 12.

Cohort A will start Monday, March 15. Cohort B will start Thursday, March 18.

Week of March 22: All students in grades 7, 8, 9, and 10.

Cohort A will start Monday, March 22. Cohort B will start Thursday, March 25.

The school day will look much different for students as many return to buildings for the first time in a year. Students and families will notice hand sanitizer stations at every building entrance. Face masks are mandatory, and bright red and white placards line the walls and hallways, designating social distancing six-feet. The smaller cohorts will minimize the number of students in the hallways between classroom changes. Every building has a six-week or more supply of hand sanitizer, rubber gloves, and personal protective equipment (PPE).

We've already welcomed students in all of our elementary grades, along with students identified with complex needs and those who are part of our Career Technical Education programs.

CCS COTA PASS PARTNERSHIP:

Through an exciting partnership with the Central Ohio Transit Authority (COTA), Columbus City Schools students in grade 8-12 will be eligible for a free COTA pass.

Students can use these bus passes for extracurricular activities, internships, other enrichment experiences such as summer programs, or to get to and from school if they prefer (but the passes are supplemental and don't replace the yellow bus services). The COTA passes will be active through August 25.

CONNECTING WITH SENIORS' FAMILIES FOR WE CARE WEDNESDAY:

Dozens of volunteers from many of our community partners took to the phone lines last week to encourage our seniors to finish strong... and to offer a bit of assistance to families who might be struggling with other needs.

During our latest We Care Wednesday on March 10, our callers checked and connected with the families of our 12th graders. Roughly 700 families received calls, with our volunteers making sure families were staying connected and providing them with additional information on graduation plans. At the same time, our callers also provided information about the 2-1-1 Help Line run by Lutheran Social Services, a helpful community resource for needs outside of school.



GREAT NEWS ABOUT IN-PERSON GRADUATIONS:

For those seniors and families who had not heard the news already, there was also a lot of excitement around plans to have in-person graduation ceremonies this year. Last month, Superintendent Dr. Dixon announced the graduation dates for the Class of 2021 and plans to hold in-person graduation ceremonies June 2-5.

The location of the graduation ceremonies is still to be determined as our teams consider the health and safety protocols that will be necessary to hold safe in-person ceremonies for our graduates and their families. All the graduation ceremonies will be live streamed as well.

ENROLL NOW IN THE CCS SUMMER EXPERIENCE:

Registration is also open for the 2021 CCS Summer Experience, which is available for free all CCS students in grades Pre-K through 12.

This "summer school" is an opportunity for students to accelerate or recover credits. The need for a rich summer experience is critical now more than ever. The District's focus this summer will be on engagement and empowerment for students and educators. Programs run for six weeks beginning on June 14.

The in-person, daily summer programming is designed with hands-on, relevant, and rigorous experiences, delivered in our schools and at several "mini camp" location with all health and safety protocols in place.

CCS is collaborating with a number of community partners to enhance the 2021 Summer Experience program including COSI, the Franklin Park Conservatory, The Ohio State University, and Columbus Department of Recreation and Parks.

The CCS Summer Experience will focus on fundamental knowledge and skills that include well-rounded content, leadership, reasoning, and social-emotional learning. With a smaller teacher-to-student ratio and following all health and safety protocols, the District's goal is to provide in-person learning at five high schools, 10 middle schools, and 13 elementary schools.
