Kent State: Four Dead in Ohio by Derf Backderf

This graphic novel focuses on the four days around the shooting at Kent State by the National Guard during the Vietnam War. Derf spent two full years extensively researching his book after having grown up in the area during the time of the shooting.

A Cave in the Clouds by Badeeah Hassan This book is the memoir of Badeeah Hassan, a Yazidi young woman who was kidnapped by ISIS when she was 18 years old. She was sold into slavery and forced into a relationship with an American who had joined ISIS.
