
Fiction Recommendations:

 - A graphic novel describing Takei's life in a Japanese internment camp.
- *Torpedoed* by Deborah Heiligman
 - The story of the SS City of Benares, a ship evacuating British children during WWII. The ship was torpedoed by a German submarine and unlikely heroes emerged.
- *Kent State* by Deborah Wiles
 - The story of May 4, 1970 told in multiple viewpoints. She spoke at the OELMA Conference this year and was amazing!



Jeffrey	Susie


Food List
