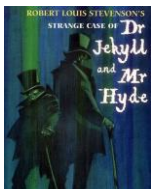

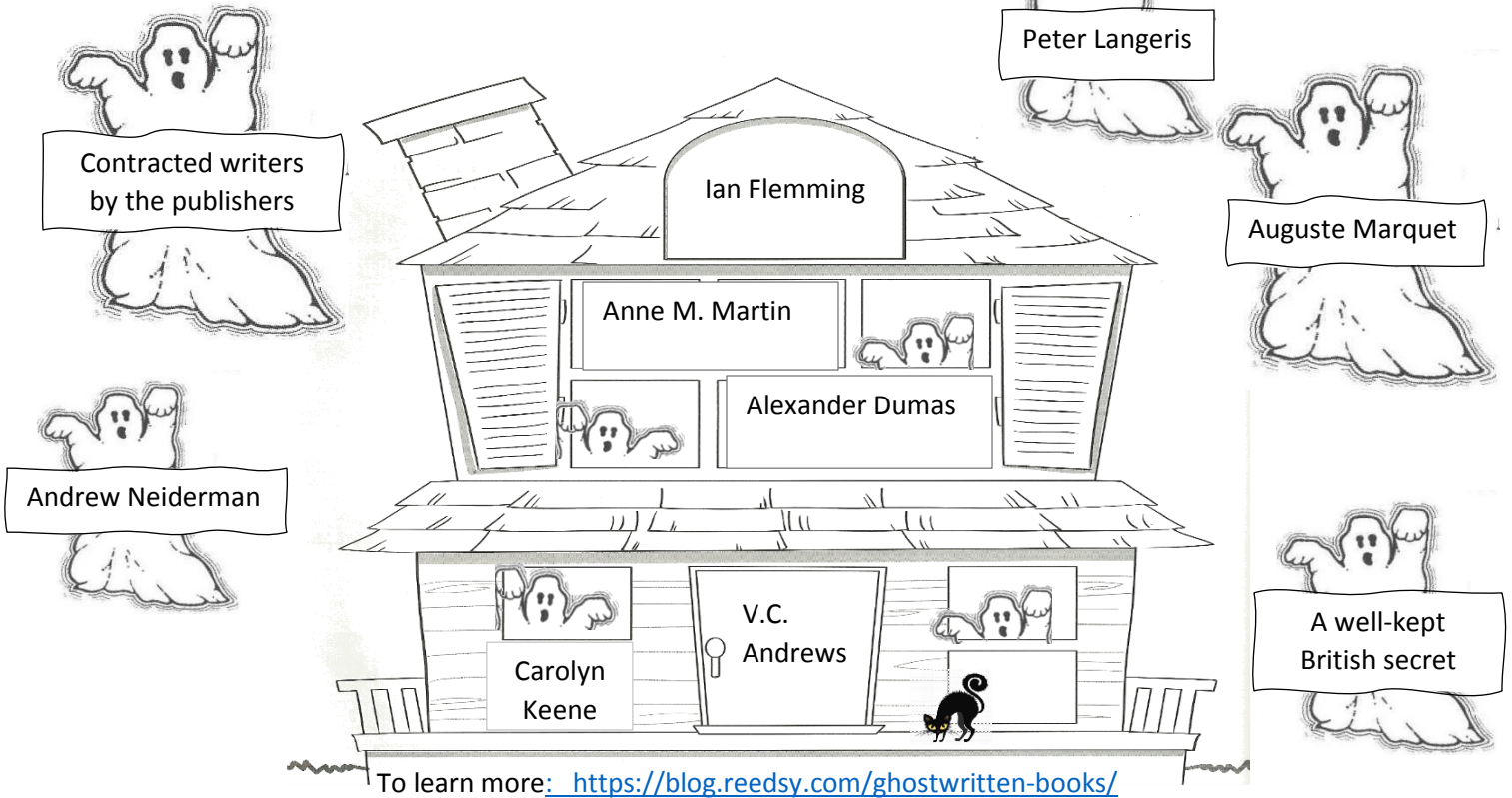

A **ghostwriter** is hired to write literary or journalistic works, speeches, or other texts that are officially credited to another person as the author. Sadly, this frequently happens when an author dies and the publisher wants to carry on the series.

Scary Stories To Tell In The Dark by Alvin Schwarz

"Why are we subjecting our children to this kind of violent material?" Sandy Vanderburg, a Seattle mother of two, asked in a 1993 *Chicago Tribune* interview. The controversial material in question was Alvin Schwarz's *Scary Stories to Tell in the Dark*. "If these books were movies, they'd be R-rated because of the graphic violence. There's no moral to them. The bad guys always win." After recounting the plot of "Just Delicious," about a woman who steals a corpse's liver to cook and feed to her husband, Vanderburg told the paper, "That's sick." <https://www.polygon.com/2019/8/14/20804222/scary-stories-to-tell-in-the-dark-banned-books>
