DRESS CODE: Official Uniform – Worn on Mondays, Wednesdays, and formal school events. Shirts must be tucked in at all times.

Unofficial uniform – Worn on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays. Long or short sleeve, black, maroon, or white polo shirt with the school crest, black pants or walking shorts (walking shorts may be worn during the first and fourth periods only) (no jeans), black belt, all-black shoes.
