- Special needs students receive individualized classroom instruction, are mainstreamed when appropriate, and receive support from Columbus City Schools Occupational & Physical Therapy, and the Adaptive Physical Education Departments.
- The Como staff, students and families practice the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) In, school-wide expectations. Our school-wide expectations are Como Dragons SOAR. Stay Safe, Ownership of Our Actions, Act Appropriately, and Respect Others.
