SCHOOL UNIFORM: All students attending The Great Windsor S.T.E.M Academy are expected to be in the appropriate school uniform daily. SPECIALTY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES/CURRICULUM

Windsor STEM is an active participant in a comprehensive literacy model called Balanced Literacy. This literacy framework encompasses the basic elements of literacy and has embedded extension material to foster critical thinking and problem-solving. During the literacy block, you will find students working in whole groups, small groups, and engaging in independent practice. Each component of the literacy block is carefully thought out to meet the needs of each child.

FAMILY SUPPORT and ENGAGEMENT

Each of our intermediate grades (4-6) is supported by a corp member from City Year. City Year provides Tier 1 and Tier 2 interventions for the students in the assigned grade level. Corp members act as peer mentors and role models for the students at Windsor.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

The instructional staff at Windsor S.T.E.M is committed to providing safe, empowered, and academically-rigorous opportunities for students. The school's tradition of having strong partnerships with area businesses is complemented by long-standing community support from St. Stephen's Community House, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Nationwide, and other community-based agencies.

This neighborhood school offers the community the opportunity to utilize the school facility. The Pine Hills Civic Association and the Yorkshire Community Organization are actively involved with the school along with Story Point.
