## WHAT MAKES THIS SCHOOL OUTSTANDING:

OUR STUDENTS and STAFF! Our school houses general elementary students in grades K-5, and the Columbus Hearing Impaired Program for preschool & kindergarten, as well as classes for deaf and hard-of-hearing students using sign language/Total Communication through grade 5. As many as 30 different school districts send students to our program for services to students with hearing loss in self-contained, mainstream, and/or inclusion settings. We provide comprehensive support services for students that are deaf and hard-of-hearing, including audiology, speech therapy, sign language interpreters, amplification, instructional assistants, work-study services, and counseling. All Huy students are given an opportunity to learn sign language. All teachers are trained in Positive Behavior Support for school-wide and classroom support. Our building promotes acceptance and support for all.

## SPECIALTY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES/CURRICULUM:

Reading, language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, health, art, vocal music, instrumental music, physical education, gifted and talented services, in addition to special services for children with hearing loss: language development, speech, auditory training and communication skills, sign language, development of fine and gross motor skills. All curriculums are aligned to Ohio's Content Standards and Preschool Standards.

**STUDENT ACTIVITIES/SPORTS:**

Field trips to various sites linked to pertinent study topics, KISS (Kids Invite Someone Special) breakfast, and Literacy Week. Elementary students have an opportunity to participate in: chess club, safety patrol, book fair, sign language choir, field day, One Book, One School Programming, and frequent family engagement events. Computer activities are available through 1:1 Chromebook distribution or in our computer lab. We have up-to-date technology in every K-5 classroom such as a Smartboard (interactive whiteboard) and document cameras. We have a strong PBIS system that allows students to earn Eagle Cash for following agreed upon expectations and use it to purchase prizes, incentives and rewards on a school store cart that is open weekly and run by community/family volunteers.
