DRESS CODE : All Students: Khaki pants/shorts/skirts. No rips or tears. Belts should be worn with pants. WHAT MAKES THIS SCHOOL OUTSTANDING

Easton Foundation has partnered with Mifflin in the development of community leaders and scholarships. Children's Hospital, North Community counseling, Ohio Dominican University, and Our Alumni are strong and support our academic and athletic excellence goals. StarFish Alliance, Thrive Mentoring Group, First Church of Christ Genesee (Pastor Ford), Foundations for Families and Communities in Schools mentor our students weekly. We also have partnerships with Ohio State University, L-Brands, Circle K, and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity Inc. that also assist with various events and support Mifflin High School.

SPECIALTY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES CURRICULUM

All core academic classes (math, science, English, social studies and AP courses) meet for 45 minutes each day these courses are year-long. Our schedule gives students the opportunity to focus on mastering the content, engage in hands-on learning, and use technology. We also have two new business classes added to Mifflin to get students ready for new careers in technology and business.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES/SPORTS

The following is a list of the programs we have in place to support our students: Scheduling- Our school day consists of an eight-period day made up of 45 minute periods. All lunch periods are 30 minutes long. Mifflin offers the College Credit Plus program (CCP) allows Ohio high school students to earn college credit and/or

high school graduation credit through the successful completion of college courses. The CCP is open to all students enrolled in the state's public, community and nonpublic high schools. The purpose of the program is to promote rigorous academic pursuits and expose students to options beyond the high school classroom. Students can complete college credit through the various local institutions such as: Columbus State, Otterbein College, Ashland University, Franklin University, The Ohio State University and Ashland University. We are offering Columbus State credits here at Mifflin.

Mifflin High School offers five Advanced Placement courses: AP Biology, AP Government, AP Calculus, AP Literature and Composition 11, and AP Literature and Composition 12. V-CAP is a district-wide opportunity for students to take a core class, to work ahead and/or take a course that they have failed. Students are permitted to take these courses after-school for free. ACT/SAT Prep Class: Mifflin offers juniors and seniors college testing preparation utilizing an ACT computer program.

Otterbein: Mifflin High School offers senior students the opportunity to attend a class through Otterbein College at Mifflin High School as dual enrollment credit options.

ESL Instruction: Mifflin offers ESL instruction and support for English Language Learners at any level of English Language Acquisition in our traditional high school setting and sheltered site.

Students are encouraged to sign up for a variety of clubs and activities. OHSA sanctioned sports include: football, girls and boys basketball, volleyball, girls and boys tennis, golf, wrestling, bowling, cross-country, track, girls and boys soccer, baseball and softball. Other activities include: band and choir, theatre, drill team, poetry slam and cheerleading. Mifflin High School also has a robotics team.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

Mifflin High School partners with AmeriCorps's City Year in an innovative school transformation model designed to work in partnership with Mifflin High School to help students stay on track, or get back on track, to graduate and succeed in post-secondary education. City Year and Communities in Schools-each one with proven track records of improving student achievement, work with the Freshman Success Academy which eases the transition to Mifflin High School for incoming 9th graders by keeping them together in a specific wing of the building and teaming them in small groups of teachers and students.
