WHAT MAKES OUR SCHOOL OUTSTANDING

What makes Parsons REALLY awesome are the incredible, highly qualified teachers! We also have: Band, Instrumental Music, Choir for 4th and 5th grader students, monthly Panther Pride Award, Channel 75 – a student produced daily news team, outdoor education trips to the Audubon for 4th graders, Metro Parks outdoor education SEED program, and monthly visits from the Columbus Zoo for 5th graders.

SPECIAL LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES/CURRICULUM

Parsons Elementary utilizes the HMH Into Reading program. This consists of whole and small group explicit instruction and collaborative learning within the allotted 90-minute reading block. Our K-2 classrooms use the Foundations program to build foundational skills (phonemic awareness, phonics and handwriting) and additionally, our K-1 classrooms use the Heggerty program - providing explicit and systematic instruction of phonemic awareness. Students in K-5 also receive a minimum of 30 minutes of writing each day. Our goal is to provide a print-rich literacy environment for each student in the classroom and at home.

Parsons Elementary utilizes the Curriculum Associates Ready Math program. This program focuses on understanding the processes and strategies that lead to effective problem solving. K-5 classrooms have a 60-minute block for math where intentional whole and small group lessons are taught. Teachers utilize mathematical discourse and formative assessments to check for understanding of concepts being taught.

Visible Learning through Teacher Clarity: Our teachers work hard to make learning visible to students. On a daily basis, they post and communicate standards aligned learning intentions, success criteria and lesson relevancy. Asking students questions like: What are we learning? Why are learning this? How will we know we have learned it? This leads to the development of assessment capable learners who are three times more likely to experience academic achievement.
