SCHOOL MISSION: We aim to provide a welcoming atmosphere in a safe learning environment that promotes academic excellence though a health science focused curriculum.

LITERACY PROGRAM: Trevitt uses the Elementary English Language Arts Framework for Columbus City Schools. The focus is on Word Recognition, Language Comprehension, Instructional Practice, Text Complexity and Text Evidence. We use the HMH Into Reading resource combining high quality texts with engaging reading and writing workshops to strengthen critical skills needed to build literacy fluency and prepare students for the challenges of progressive grade level standards and Ohio's State Tests (OST).

MATH PROGRAM: Trevitt uses the *Ready Ohio Mathematics* creating a rich classroom environment in which students at all levels become active, real-world problem solvers. Through teacher-led instruction, students develop mathematical reasoning, engage in meaningful discourse, and build strong mathematical habits. The program's instructional framework embeds Standards for Mathematical Practice, builds on students' prior knowledge, incorporates a classroom mathematics routine and prepares students for the challenges of Ohio's State Tests (OST).

CURRICULUM: Trevitt is one of six Health Sciences Academies in the district. Students enjoy a strong curriculum in reading, writing, math, social studies, art, music and physical education, employing the CCS Core Instructional Framework with an overarching focus on health sciences.

DRESS CODE: Trevitt Elementary School has a uniform dress code.
