



# Providing Literacy Support at Home



The key to your child's future.

# Why is it important to provide Literacy Support at home?

- Involvement with reading activities at home has a positive influences on reading achievement, language comprehension and expressive language skills.
- (Gest, Freeman, Domitrovich & Welsh, 2004), but also on pupils' interest in reading, attitudes towards reading and attentiveness in the classroom (Rowe, 1991).





## What activities can be done at home?

- Read Everyday
- IncreaseVocabulary
- ■Write



## Reading a book.

Provide 15-20 min. of reading time every day.



#### When reading to your child:

- Read the title and ask your child to make a prediction.
- Look through some of the pictures in the book and have your child share what they think is happening.
- Ask questions after reading to check for understanding.

### Reading a book.

When your child is reading, make sure they have a book at their right level.

#### Encourage your child to:

- Figure out words. (Stretch out words, identify parts of words and use context cues and picture cues.)
- Self-correct their errors.
- Re-read if they don't understand.
- Have them share what the book was about and ask clarifying questions. Have students use evidence from the text.



## Increase Vocabulary

- Point out vocabulary all around you. (ex. at home, at the grocery store, in your neighborhood)
- Talk with your child to increase their vocabulary.
- Practice High Frequency Words





## Provide opportunities for your child to write.



Have pencil and paper around for your child to write things down.

Write for a variety of purposes. (ex. create list, journal their thoughts, write letters, write a story, write a summary of a book they have read)



#### Ohio Fall 2018 Writing Pilot

The Fall Writing Pilot is live for administration October 8 - October 19th. Only students in Grades 7-12 are able to participate in the Pilot. Students should take the assessment that they took in the spring of 2018. For example, students in grade 7 should take the grade 6 pilot test. For the ELA1 and ELA2 tests, students in grades 10-12 should take the assessment that they were eligible for the previous year. Results from the pilot will be used to help with future administrations. Scores will not be available for individual students. Please see the chart below for grades that will be eligible for testing and which assessment they will take:

## Third Grade Reading Guarantee

- Must receive a score of 181 or higher on the BOY MAP assessment or the student is placed on a RIMP (September)
- Must receive a score of 677 or higher on the fall AIR assessment or the student is placed on a RIMP (October 29, 30)
- Must receive a score of 181 or higher on the MOY MAP assessment or the student is placed on a RIMP (December or January)
- Must receive a score of 193 or higher on MOY or EOY MAP or a score of 677 or higher on the fall or spring AIR assessment to be promoted to fourth grade (May)



### What is a RIMP?

- A RIMP is a Reading Improvement Monitoring Plan.
- Students in grades K-3 are placed on a RIMP if they do not meet certain cut scores on standardized assessments.
- If a student is placed on a RIMP during the school year, they stay on a RIMP until the end of the school year, even if they earn a required score on an assessment at a later time.
- RIMPS are updated and reported quarterly.
- RIMPS are signed by a parent...you will know if your child is on a RIMP.




### Conferences
