








2020 SENIOR OPTIONS

MODIFIED ADDITIONAL GRADUATION OPTIONS

CLASS OF 2020 Students who entered Grade 9 between July 1, 2016, and June 30, 2017

Take all **SEVEN OHIO STATE TEST** (OST) end-of-course exams.

Score 2 or less on any Math or English Language Arts test and you must retake the test at least once.

Meet at least **TWO** of the following options:

- 2.5 Grade Point Average for 11th and 12th-grade years (must complete four full-year courses each year)
- Senior Capstone Project
 - Complete 120 hours of work or community service experience 12th-grade year
- Earn 3 or more College Credit Plus credits
- Earn credit and earn 3 on AP exam
- Earn credit and earn 4 on IB exam
- Earn 3 on each of three WorkKeys sections
- Earn 3 points of State Board-approved industry credentials
- Meet OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal requirements







MODIFIED ADDITIONAL GRADUATION OPTIONS



INDUSTRY CREDENTIAL OPTION

12-point Microsoft Office Suite (MOS) Credential is offered at every high school

- PowerPoint
- Word
- Excel
- Outlook





Each test has two levels. **Each test is worth 3 points**Industry Credential Prep

GMetrix: provides untimed training with hints and timed simulated practice MOS tests







PERMANENT GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

AVAILABLE FOR CLASSES OF 2020 & BEYOND!

In addition to course completion, students must:

- 1. Show Competency
- 2. Demonstrate College/Career Preparation



Classes of 2020 and 2022: Complete one of the original three options OR the new 2023 requirements.

This allows students to demonstrate skills and knowledge needed to be **READY FOR SUCCESS** after they transition to the next steps post-high school.



COMPETENCY



OHIO's STATE TESTS (OST's)

Earn scores on end-of-course tests that demonstrate competency* in Math I and English II.





- Biology
- American Government
- American History.

These end-of course exam scores will only be used to determine optional seals for College and Career College/Career Prep. Readiness

*ODE will set scores by March 2020





COMPETENCY



OPTIONS OTHER THAN PASSING OSTS

Students **NOT** scoring competent on a test *must receive remedial* supports and retake the exams at least once. If a student still does not score competent, they may use an alternate demonstration:



College Credit Plus: Earn credit for one math and one English course through College Credit Plus.



Career Experience & Technical Skill: Complete two demonstrations, at least one of which must be foundational:

Foundational: Proficient on three WebXams, approved industry credential (12 points), pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an apprenticeship program

Supporting: Workplace experience, WorkKeys (14) or the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal



Military Readiness: Meet the requirements to enlist in the military, including AFQT requirements, as demonstrated by a contract with the military to enlist.



COLLEGE & CAREER PREPARATION

STATE SEAL CHOICES



To demonstrate Preparation for College or Career, students must earn two diploma seals, <u>one of</u> which must be state defined:

State Defined:

- 1. <u>OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal</u> Demonstrate professional skills
- 2. <u>Industry-Recognized Credential</u> Seal Earn 12 points worth of approved credentials
- 3. College-Ready Seal Score <u>remediation-free on the ACT or SAT</u> in Math and English
- 4. Military Enlistment Seal Participate in JROTC and/or enroll in the military
- 5. Citizenship Seal Score proficient on the American History and American Government end of course tests
- 6. Science Seal Score proficient on the Biology end of course test
- 7. Honors Diploma Seal <u>Meet the requirements</u> set by the State Board of Education
- 8. <u>Seal of Biliteracy</u> Demonstrate levels of proficiency in at least one other language
- 9. Technology Seal—Complete advanced coursework in a technology field





COLLEGE & CAREER PREPARATION



STATE SEALS

To demonstrate Preparation for College or Career, students must earn two diploma seals, one of which may be locally defined:

Locally Defined by Columbus City Schools:

- 10. Community Service Seal Complete community service using locally-developed guidelines
- 11. Fine and Performing Arts Seal Demonstrate skills using locally-developed guidelines
- 12. Certified Student Engagement Seal Participate in meaningful activities such as athletics, clubs and student government as defined by locally-developed guidelines


