Every student at Northgate Intermediate will make 2 years' worth of growth in reading and math by the end of fifth grade using current district/statewide assessment tools for evaluation.

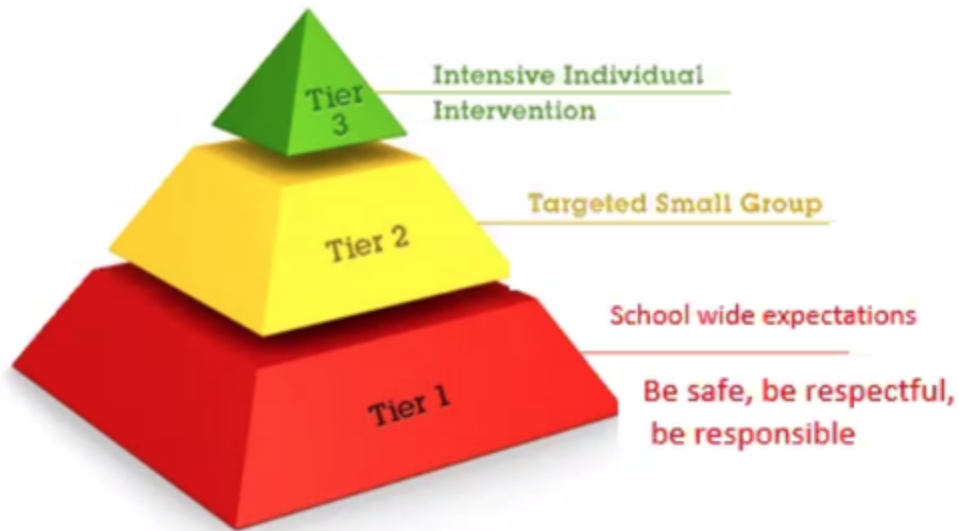
Mission

- Classroom rewards (for example: 85% positive Dojo point party)

Criteria for Attending the Quarterly PBIS Party Includes:

-No PEAK write-up for the quarter

-No U's in the Behavior Section of the report card for the quarter

-85% or more positive Dojo points for the quarter
