

This school year has been packed with fun and exciting School Counseling activities at Windsor STEM! This Spring I have been working with Windsor teachers to provide classroom school counseling lessons or pull small groups weekly.



Social Emotional Learning- For February we celebrated Black History Month through an Artist Study of Kehinde Wiley. Wiley is most recognized for his portrait of Barack Obama displayed in the Washington Smithsonian. Students embodied the concept of living within and perceiving Windsor Staff and Community Members as being part of Black History. Staff volunteers posed in Renaissance poses Wiley has used in his portraits, students selected a staff member, cut them out and pasted them on a floral background done in the style of Wiley.

AcademicTo kick off Women's History Month, we read a "A Street Called Home" by Aminah Robinson, a beloved artist and author from Columbus, in classroom guidance lessons. This magical pop up book inspired by Robinson's childhood experiences growing up in the Munt Vernon neighborhood fueled conversations about communities, roles and laws. In small groups and classroom lessons, students collectively created an Aminah Robinson styled Bulletin Board of South Linden by adding their trusted adults, community buildings and pictures of favorite landmarks.
