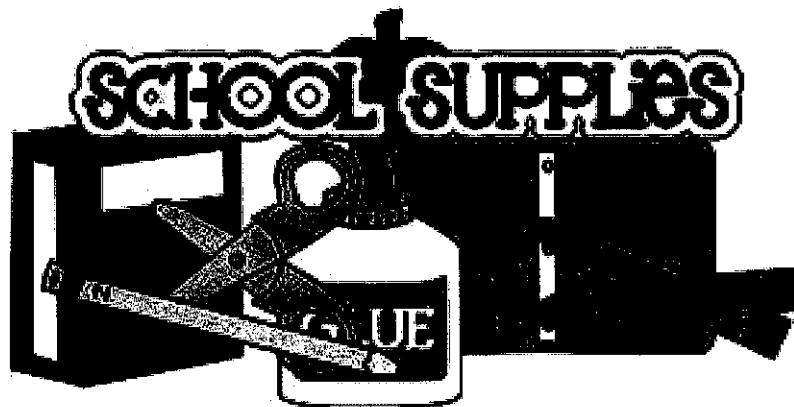

## Getting ready for 5th grade

Please keep reading and practicing math over the summer! Even doing a few hours of reading and math each week this summer can help prevent the “summer slide,” the real phenomenon that results in kids performing worse in August than they did in May.

There isn't an official reading log, but reading does matter. Ways to help encourage summer reading:

- Join the summer reading program at any Columbus public library
- Participate in the free programs at Barnes and Noble or Half Price Books
- Listen to audio books in the car -- especially when going on trips out of town
- Log into Sora to download e books or audio books
- Print out free fact practice sheets from Math-drills.com

Math is just as important as reading. Students should spend 15-20 minutes on iReady lessons a few times a week, and another 15-20 minutes a few times a week practicing math fact fluency (flash cards or online fact games).

Dear Future 6<sup>th</sup> Graders,

Welcome to 6<sup>th</sup> grade at Indianola! Cindy Gunn, Trina Marschall and Tiffany Meyer will teach math, social studies, science, and English language arts to their homerooms. You will have physical education every day for one semester (taught by Clay Blackburn); you will have visual art every day for one semester (Rachel Rowen will be your teacher for this class). If you are in a band, strings, or choir, you will work with Ruth Hall throughout the week. Heather Williams and Ebone Dansby are our resource room teachers. Some of you will have Jon Brush for math. Over the summer, we'd like you to do a few things to prepare for 6<sup>th</sup> grade:

1. Read 1 (at least) REALLY GOOD novel this summer. By "really good," we mean books that are just right for you: you can understand it on your own, and you enjoy reading it. A "novel" just means a fiction book, written in chapters (as opposed to a picture book). **Please bring the book with you on the first day of school.**

You will need to be prepared to share your book with other people. This will be done either through a project or a book talk. Make sure you can explain the book to others; you know the characters, the genre, theme, setting, etc.

2. Work as much as you need to, to KNOW your multiplication facts, 1-12. You can use any method you like for this, including using flashcards or on the computer. This will be your first math assessment.

3. Practice your typing skills. Practice as much as you need to, so that you can type a page (about 250 words) in 20-30 minutes. You can use Typing Agent for this, or any method you choose. There are many other free online programs to help you with this, including: BBC Dance Mat Typing, Typing Adventure, and Learning Games for Kids (Keyboard Practice).
