Continue to talk to your students about bullying as we are also playing our part in providing the resources needed. If students are being bullied, they need to make sure they are telling an adult. As the weather gets warmer, we would not want to take recess away completely.

Attendance/House Bill 410

School attendance is a powerful predictor of student outcomes. Every school day, every hour, every minute and every second counts in a child's academic life. A missed school day is a lost opportunity for students to learn.

Excessive absences interfere with students' progress in mastering knowledge and skills necessary to graduate from high school to prepare for higher education and the workforce.

Below is the average percentage of attendance for each grade level. Our goal is always to reach at least 92%.

Ohio State Testing

Students in grades $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ will begin to take the Ohio State Test each day at 9:30 am. The tests are in 2 parts

- ELA testing Tuesday, April 1th and Wednesday, April 2nd
- Math testing Thursday, April 10th and Friday, April 26th

Please make sure students are here in attendance on both days to complete both test. The secrets to best practices before testing are:

- Get enough sleep the night before testing
- Eat a healthy breakfast on the day off testing
- Stay calm and positive
- Make sure to ask the teacher for clarification on key concepts.

Emergency Contact Information

Is your Emergency Contact Information up-to-date? It is extremely important that we are able to contact you in the event there is a situation with your child. You can update emergency information using the parent portal. Please make sure that you have reliable alternates listed should your child need to be picked up from school. *Anyone retrieving a student from school must have proper picture identification*.

Transportation from School

Does your child know how he/she gets home from school each day? Constant changes to your child's dismissal plan create confusion for the child as well as additional work for the teaching and office staff. Changes to dismissal should be used sparingly. All changes must be written or called in to the school office by 2:00pm each day. The sooner the better! *Failure to follow this protocol will result in your child being sent home using the regular mode of transportation unless you are here to physically retrieve them.*
