

Student FAQ

Q: When do I return to In-Person Learning?

A: Students in grades 11 (2022) and 12 (2021) will begin blended learning the week of March 15th. Cohort A will start on Monday, March 15, and Cohort B will start on Thursday, March 18.

Students in grades 9 (2024) and 10 (2023) will begin blended learning on March 22. Cohort A will start on Monday, March 22, and Cohort B will start on Thursday, March 25. Students will attend classes at school two days per week and at home three days per week. Students in grades 9/10 will have asynchronous work during the week of March 15th.

Q: Is the district providing transportation to and from school?

A: For those students who live outside of a 2-mile radius from the school, CCS will provide transportation. Additionally, unlimited COTA transportation is being made available for 9th-12th grade students. A Google Form was sent out through e-mail for this to be requested. The COTA pass should be available for use after March 15th.

Q: What do I do if I have issues with transportation or need to get a route changed?

A: If you are having issues with transportation call the CCS Transportation Department at 614-365-5074. If you need a route changed, please notify a teacher before 1pm. They will contact Mrs. Wilson, our Records/Transportation Secretary, and she will follow up with you.

Q: Do I need to bring my Chromebook to school?

A: Yes, you will need to bring your Chromebook to school daily. Please make sure to have your Chromebook fully charged before attending school each day. You are also encouraged to bring your headphones or earbuds for instructional purposes.

Q: Where will my classes be held?

A: Follow your schedule. If you are scheduled for choir classes, you will meet in the auditorium.

Q: Will the bell schedule remain the same?

A: No. Beginning on March 15th, the bell schedule will be adjusted. See the schedule below. For those students not returning until the week of March 22nd, you will be given asynchronous assignments.

Q: How many students will be in my classes?

A: All classrooms have been set up for 15 students or as many that can be in the room and maintain appropriate social distancing.

Q: Will I still need to take my attendance?

A: You will need to continue taking your attendance on “Click Days” and Wednesdays. On days when you are physically in the building, your teacher will take your attendance.

Q: Will there be Safety/Security in the Building?

A: We have 2 building assigned members of the Safety/Security team, Mr. Perkins and Mr. Long.

Q: Will I be assigned a locker?

A: No. You will be permitted to carry your belongings in a book bag. You will be responsible for your belongings. We plan on making clear book bags available in the near future for you.

Q: What will be different?

A: As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, we have had to make many adjustments for your safety:

- First, you will be required to *properly* wear a mask all day. If you don't have a mask, a limited supply will be available for you.
- We have placed hand sanitizer throughout the building and the classrooms for your use.
- You are encouraged to bring bottled water as you will not have access to the water fountains. We will have limited water available for you as well.
- There is also new signage to help direct you. Be sure to follow it and walk on the right side of the hallway.

- Some other procedures will change to maintain social distancing and safety. Be sure to check out the “What to Expect” video on the Marion-Franklin High School Facebook page as well as the Marion-Franklin High School website.

Q: What if I have concerns about my safety and I am hesitant to return to the building?

A: Those concerns are understandable. Please be assured that the entire staff will follow safety protocols. If you still feel uncertain, please reach out to your grade level administrator or counselor to discuss your concerns. Additionally, your parent can write an absence note for you to have up to 9 absences excused.

Q: I have Credit Recovery to do. Can I stay after school to work on it?

A: We will have run a Credit Recovery lab after school from 2:35-4:00 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. There will be a virtual lab on Wednesday. The Zoom link for the virtual lab is below:

Q: Will I be able to stay after school for other activities or wait on my transportation?

A: If you are involved in athletics, you will need to report to the appropriate supervised locations specified by your coach, advisor or Athletic Director. Students who are waiting for rides will be asked to immediately exit the building. In the event of rain, you can wait underneath covered outside areas. To avoid this, please make sure your transportation is here by or before dismissal at 2:30 pm.

Q: Can I stay after school for tutoring?

A: No. Again, we will be asking that students immediately leave the building so our custodial staff can begin cleaning. There are various Learning Extension Centers available for help with assignment. You can find this information on the CCS District website.

Q: Do I still need to follow school dress code and other school rules?

A: Yes. The school dress code and all other school rules will still be enforced. Please refer to the Guide to Student Success on the CCS District website.

Q: Will we still be permitted to go to the gym to play basketball and other activities during lunch?

A: No. This is for your safety. You will be asked to remain in your seat in the cafeteria, or you will be able to go and sit in a designated spot in the gym.

Q: Will I be able to leave class on a hall pass to go to the restroom or elsewhere?

A: We will not be using hall passes so that we can better maintain safety and closely monitor hallway traffic. You will need to go to the restroom in between classes. No more than 3 students should be in the restroom at any time. If you have a restroom emergency during class, please let your teacher know. Your teacher can call the main office, and someone will be sent to escort you to the restroom.

Q: Can I leave the building for lunch or have food delivered?

A: No, students are not permitted to leave the premises for lunch and no outside food can be brought into the building. Delivery from vendors such as Grubhub or Doordash has never been permitted. Deliveries will not be accepted, and drivers will be turned away or your order will be confiscated until the end of the day.

Q: What do I do if I am sick or live with someone who may have COVID 19?

A: We are asking that if you are sick or are experiencing any signs of COVID 19, that you stay at home. If you have been told by any entity to quarantine, you are also to remain at home. As a reminder, signs of COVID-19 include the following:

- Fever
- New or worsened cough
- Loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- New or worsened nasal congestion or runny nose
- Headache, body aches new or worsened fatigue
- Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea

Please call our school nurse immediately if someone that you live with has COVID 19.

Q: How will the school be cleaned?

A: Our custodial staff works diligently to clean and sanitize surface areas within the building. Our staff will also be wiping desks and tables in between classes. You can do your part by making sure to wash your hands frequently and using the hand sanitizer throughout the building.
