



School Schedule: Cohort A/B/D

- Doors open at 8:30 a.m. for students.
 - Breakfast starts at 8:30 a.m./students eat in the classroom.
- Lunch for 4th Grade at 11:20 am/5th Grade at 11:40 am (eat in the classrooms).
 - Recess for 4th Grade at 12:00 pm/5th Grade at 12:35 p.m.
 - Indoor recess for the first few weeks in February (weather).
- Dismissal starts at 3:15 p.m.
 - Carriders released from the gymnasium starting 3:15 p.m.
 - We used to have students outside but now will be inside reminder of the school year.
 - Set up in the parking lot for safe pickup.
 - Walkers released at 3:20 p.m.
 - Buses will be called at 3:20 p.m.

Asynchronous "Click" Days

School Schedule: Cohort A/B/D

- Cohort A "Click Days" are Thursday and Friday, while Cohort B "Click Days" are Monday and Tuesday. Students will participate in asynchronous (independently without a live teacher) content (ELA, Math, SS, and Sci) lessons, synchronous (live with the teacher) unified arts lessons, and may also participate in synchronous small group intervention or enrichment depending on student identified need.
 - Complex Needs or also referred to as Cohort D come four days a week (M/T/TH/F).
- WEDNESDAYS: Students will participate in a synchronous (live with the teacher) morning meeting, asynchronous (independently w/o a live teacher) content (ELA, Math, SS, & Sci) lessons, synchronous unified arts lessons, and may also participate in synchronous small group intervention or enrichment depending on student identified need.

Bus Procedures




Safety Protocols:

- Extra mask on site for students & staff/student & staff desk shields/hand sanitizer stations and hand sanitizer in each classroom/student separate room from nurse's office.
- Full time nurse
- Smaller classroom enrollment with Cohort A/B with 6-foot distancing/floor signage.
- Smaller bus capacity to/from school.
- No Visitors in the building (including parents)
 - Students will be escorted out to the parent/guardian vehicle if leaving early (sign out booklet/identification needed).
- Keep your child home if they have a fever/show characteristics or symptoms of COVID-19 (fever/constant cough/congestion/etc.).
- Students should bring at least 2 mask, but we have extras.
- Emergency/Contact Cards will be sent home first day students come to school and need to be returned the next day.

- 2 Individual must isolate for at least 10 days from date of initial symptom and until 24+ hours without fever and other symptoms improved. Isolation means physical separation from others to prevent exposure.
- Individual must quarantine for 10 days from date of most recent exposure to someone with COVID-19. Quarantine means physical separation from others to monitor for symptoms.
- Cohort, classroom or team of someone with COVID-19 may quarantine for 10 days from date of most recent exposure. Quarantine means physical separation from others to monitor for symptoms.
- 2 Symptoms may include, but are not limited to: fever, subjective fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, chills, fatigue, headache, body aches, congestion, runny nose, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, loss of taste or loss of smell.
- Other diagnoses may include, but are not limited to: allergies, asthma, common cold, croup, influenza, parainfluenza, pertussis and strep throat.
- Is since no diagnosis is confirmed, public health conducts an investigation to determine other epidemiologic links or causes of illness. Dependent upon the outcome of the investigation, the cohort, classroom or team of the synchronization individual may still need to outcarratine.

Protocol for Nurse Office Visits



- Please notify the office that you have a student who is not feeling well and what their symptoms are.
- Based on the student's symptoms will determine if they should be sent to the nurse's office.
 - If the student is having any of the following symptoms the nurse will meet with the child in the hallway to assess and determine next steps
 - Fever greater than 100.4
 - New or worsened cough
 - Loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Nasal congestion or runny nose
 - Headache
 - Body ache
 - New or worsened fatigue
 - If the student has symptoms that are not listed above and cannot be addressed with the tools provided in your "goodie bags" please call the nurses office to discuss and we will make a plan based on each situation.


Separation Room




We will have 2 separation rooms

- Peak room: This room will be used first due to its location and ease of monitoring
- 2. Music room: This will be our overflow room
- 3. Both rooms will be have cameras where the students can be monitored at all times.
- 4. Inside the separation room the students will have to wear a mask and continue to maintain social distancing.
- 5. The goal is for parents to pick up the child within 30 minutes and if they can't, they have several back up plans.





6ft Distancing Classroom Desk/Plexiglass







