I Some of our students will have to participate in the Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment (OELPA). This test is required for all students who speaks English as a second language. The window for this test is Feb 1 through March 29. This is the only test that will be administered in person at Sherwood during the school day. Due to COVID, we did not participate in the spring Ohio State Test (OST), formally known as the AIR test, last school year. This spring, we are anticipating the OST will take place for all students in Ohio. The window for this test opens in March for reading and April for math and 8th grade science. Lastly, the iReady End of the Year (EOY) assessment will begin in May for reading and math at all grade levels.

It's so important all students complete the assessments they are required to take, take their time, and do their very best not only for the purposes of Sherwood Middle School, but also their potential placement into high school classes (for 8th graders), as well as identifying true skill levels for 6th and 7th graders for the next academic year.
