ARRIVAL to School & BREAKFAST Policy

Students may enter the building beginning at 7:00 AM

through the commons area doors. After entering the building, students wanting breakfast should go directly to the breakfast line and to the lunchroom to eat. All other students should report to the auditorium. Students will be released to their

lockers and 1st period classes at the 7:20 AM bell. THE BREAK-FAST LINE WILL CLOSE PROMPT-LY AT 7:20 A.M. No one will be served after that time (unless there is a late bus).

After the first warning bell at 7:20 AM, students must enter only through the front doors. Students must enter the building immediately when arriving. Students are NOT permitted to leave school grounds after arriving by bus, car, or walking. Congregating outside is NOT permitted.

Students arriving after 7:30 a.m. are marked tardy.



CLOSED LUNCH Policy

Students are not allowed to leave school grounds during the lunch periods. Students eat lunch 4b, 5b, or 6b periods. Students are not permitted to bring outside food (fast food,

etc.) into the building or have food delivered. Students are not permitted to sit in their cars or loiter in the parking lot during the lunch periods, and may NOT sit in front of the building.



Students MUST remain in the building for lunch.

Attendance—House Bill 410

Recently new legislation was passed the previous school year regarding student attendance in Ohio schools. HB 410 defines truancy as "habitual truant" and changes attendance from days to hours. The new definition is:

-Absent 30 or more consecutive hours without a legitimate excuse. -Absent 42 or more hours in one school month without legitimate excuse. -Absent 72 or more hours in one school year without a legitimate excuse. -Includes excessive absences: 38 or more hours in one school month, and 65 or more hours in one school year-with or without legitimate excuse.



Our goal is to see every student attend school regularly. Being at school has a huge impact on your child's academic success. Even as your child grows older and shows more independence, parents and students get to school every day and to reinforce why attendance is so important in school and in life. We understand that some absences

that are unavoidable due to health or other circumstances. We also know that when students miss too much school. regardless of the reason, it can cause them to fall behind. By 9th grade, good attendance can predict graduation rates families play a key role in making sure even more than 8th grade test scores. Absences add up quickly! Going to school MATTERS! Even high school students need:



with attendance

- Regular bedtimes morning routines.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before
- Make sure your teen goes to school every day unless he or she is sick
- Develop back-up plans for getting to and from school if something comes up (like missing the bus.)
- Avoid scheduling Dr. appointments, vacations during school time.

Campus Wear Uniform & Dress Code

Mifflin High School requires that ALL students dress according to the Campus Wear uniform policy. The goal of this policy is to provide a professional dress environment aligning to the District's mission to create a climate in which each and every student learns.

REQUIREMENTS:



Color: KHAKI only.

Material: Cotton or Twill.

Pants must be fitted properly, hemmed, and worn at the waist.

Skirt and shorts length must be at the top of the knee or longer, and may **not** be tight-fitted.

PANTS & SKIRTS



NOT ALLOWED:

Jeans, Denim, corduroy, sweat pants, wind pants, pajama pants, yoga pants, stretch pants are **not** allowed.

Spirit Wear days still RE-QUIRE students to wear KHA-KI pants. No sweatpants or Athletic Team pants or dance skirts are permitted.



Shirts, Jackets, Sweaters, Sweatshirts

REQUIREMENTS:

Color: Royal Blue, Dark Blue, Black, Grey ONLY.

Must be solid in color. NO writing or symbols not related to Mifflin.

Style: **MUST** have a **COLLAR** with either short sleeves or long sleeves. Polo or oxford type are the required look.

Sweaters may be V-neck, crew neck, or cardigan and must have a shirt with a collar underneath.

Sweatshirts may be with hoods or crew neck but MUST have a shirt with a collar underneath.

Spirit Wear Days do permit Mifflin HS and Mifflin Pride writing, phrases, or Athletic Uniform tops.

Shoes, Hats, Hijabs, Belts

Shoes: No open toed, no flip flops or slides. No hats inside the building. Hijabs: Must be solid in the same colors as shirt requirements. Belts should be worn to keep pants at the waist.

Earning an Ohio High School Diploma Graduation Requirements

There is no one-size-fits-all way to graduate. Ohio gives you several pathways to qualify for a high school diploma. Choose the way that works best for you!

To earn a high school diploma in Ohio, you must complete the courses shown below and then choose a pathway on the right to show that you are ready for college or a job. Here's what you need to do to graduate. Your school counselor will give you more details.

Complete Courses

Take and earn a state minimum of 20 credits in specific subjects.

English language arts	4 credits	
Health	1/2 credit	
Mathematics	4 credits	
Physical education	1/2 credit	and
Science	3 credits	
Social studies	3 credits	
Electives	5 credits	

Other Requirements

Limited English Proficient (LEP) assessments.

You also must receive instruction in economics and financial literacy and complete at least two semesters of fine arts. Your district may require more than 20 credits to graduate.



Show That You Are Ready

Use at least one pathway to show that you are ready for college or a job.

Ohio's State Tests

Earn at least 18 points on seven end-of-course state tests. Endof-course tests are:

Algebra I or Integrated Math I Geometry or Integrated Math II American Government American History

English I English II Biology

Each test score earns you up to five graduation points. You must have a minimum of four points in math, four points in English and six points across science and social studies. Your school and district receive grades on the Ohio School Report Cards for all students' scores and participation on state tests.

Industry credential and workforce readiness

Earn a minimum of 12 points by receiving a State Board of Education-approved, industry-recognized credential or group of credentials in a single career field and earn the required score on WorkKeys, a work-readiness test. The state of Ohio will pay one time for you to take the WorkKeys test.

College and career readiness tests

Earn remediation-free scores in mathematics and English language arts on either the ACT or SAT.

The Ohio Department of Higher Education works with Ohio's universities to set the remediation-free scores for the ACT and SAT tests. Periodically, for a variety of reasons, these scores may be adjusted. For all high school juniors, the remediation-free scores set by Feb. 1 of their junior year will be used to meet their graduation requirement. The most up-to-date information regarding remediation-free scores can be found on the Department's graduation requirements webpage.
