## A Day at CDHS:

**1st Year:** Curriculum and Instruction for Early Childhood Education & Health, Safety and Nutrition for learning environments. Project-based assignments and off location one day a week interning in real classrooms with young children and teachers.

**2nd Year:** Education & Training Capstone, Early Childhood Education Principles & Infant & Toddler Education. Finishing the Child Development Associate (CDA) Industry Credential through completion of CDA Portfolio, Verification of Teaching Visit and Child Development Assessment. Students intern or are employed as Teaching Assistants 3 to 4 afternoons a week.

## About Us:

You will need a state issued photo ID to complete the Ohio BCI & FBI background fingerprint check; for Junior year internship and Senior year early employment eligibility in licensed Child Care Centers (approximate cost \$70). ODJFS Employee Medical Statement completed every year ([www.odjfs.org](http://www.odjfs.org) Child Care Form JFS01296). Complete a Non-Conviction Statement. Other requirements include: two letters of Professional Recommendation from your current or former teacher, counselor, coach, principal, employer, or internship/volunteer supervisor.

Through role playing, observation and internship participation, you will learn principles of child development and effective classroom management to meet high quality educating standards.

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
